

(1) Arrival

- (1.1) Patrol members should arrive for the morning patrol at 0845 at the latest
- (1.2) Patrol Captain and IRB personnel should arrive at 0830 to gain access to the IRB shed and begin setting up the IRB

(2) IRB Set-Up

- (2.1) Setting up the IRB should be the first priority of the patrol, as the patrol cannot sign on with Surfcom until the IRB is operational
- (2.2) The IRB Driver should check the IRB log book
- (2.3) The IRB Driver and Crew should follow the standard set-up procedures for the IRB:
 - (2.3.1) prepare an IRB fuel bladder
 - (2.3.2) run the IRB motor for 3-5 minutes
 - (2.3.3) check the IRB hull, bungs, and pontoons, and place IRB signs on the beach
 - (2.3.4) check all seven (7) items of ancillary gear for the IRB
- (2.4) IRB personnel should undertake any other set-up procedures outlined by the IRB Captain

(3) Roles of the Patrol Captain

- (3.1) The Patrol Captain should access the Captain's Office and get radios
 - (3.1.1) Radios should be distributed to senior patrol members and to the IRB driver
- (3.2) Open the patrol room
- (3.3) Liaise with the Council Lifeguard about placement of the flags
- (3.4) Delegate other tasks to patrol members
 - (3.4.1) Oxygen and AED Kits to be checked by ART members
 - (3.4.2) First Aid Kits to be checked for contents according to the approved list
 - (3.4.3) Rescue boards (4) from the IRB shed should be placed at rips and other dangerous locations
 - (3.4.4) Rescue tubes (4) from the patrol room should be placed near the flags
 - (3.4.5) Spinal gear, loudhailer, sunscreen, and swim fins should be placed in the patrol tent
 - (3.4.6) Optional gear: patrol esky with ice, binoculars, patrol cooler with drinking water

(4) Patrol Log

- (4.1) Every patrol member must be wearing full uniform to sign on to patrol
- (4.2) Every patrol member should fill in their details in the Patrol Log Book
- (4.3) Patrol members must fill out relevant qualifications (Bronze, IRBC, IRBD, SpM, ARTC, FA, SMAEC, BBM, Gold) in the first column
- (4.4) Members must tell the Patrol Captain before signing on, and receive the Patrol Captain's permission before signing-off
 - (4.4.1) Members absent from the patrol area without the Patrol Captain's permission will be crossed out of the Log Book

(5) Radio Sign-On

- (5.1) The Patrol Captain or a delegated Bronze member should use the radio to sign on to Surfcom on Surf Channel 2
- (5.2) The sign-on call should include the following information:
 - (5.2.1) Beach status (open or closed)
 - (5.2.2) IRB status
 - (5.2.3) Number of Bronze members on patrol
- (5.3) If Surfcom does not respond to repeated radio calls, the Patrol Captain should use the phone in the patrol room to call Surfcom on 9982 5959
- (5.4) Sign-on must be completed by 0910 at the absolute latest, otherwise the patrol is in breach of Branch regulations. Patrols should aim to sign on by 0900 on all occasions.
