

(1) Use

- (1.1) The patrol tent (“tent”) should only be used on weekends for rostered patrol duties
- (1.2) North Steyne SLSC is under contractual sponsorship obligations to erect the tent during all rostered patrol hours
- (1.3) Any additional uses of the tent must be authorized in writing (email acceptable) by the Club Captain, Club Vice-Captain, or Club President

(2) Placement

- (2.1) The tent should be placed in close proximity to the red and yellow flags
- (2.2) Consideration should be given to line-of-sight from the Council Lifeguard room to the flags when placing the tent
- (2.3) The position of the tent shall be determined by the active Patrol Captain of the rostered patrol
- (2.4) The tent pegs should always be covered with orange cones or other visible safety coverage

(3) Dismantling the Tent

- (3.1) The tent may be lowered during patrol hours in severe weather, provided the following action is taken by the patrol:
 - (3.1.1) Tent is lowered safely with due consideration given to bystanders
 - (3.1.2) The tent poles are lowered and removed prior to pegs being uprooted, to ensure there is no chance that the tent can blow over while being dismantled
 - (3.1.3) Surfcom is contacted to inform the SNB Duty Officer that the tent is being lowered due to severe wind conditions
- (3.2) The Patrol Captain should ensure that members have adequate shelter—either structural or clothing—to continue their regular beach surveillance

(4) Danger and Damage

- (4.1) The tent should not be erected if, in the opinion of the Patrol Captain, it would be a danger to Club members or to the public
- (4.2) All functional damage to the tent should be reported to the Club Vice-Captain
