# President's Forward

Along with calling the season to an abrupt end at the end of March, there were storms, an infestation of seaweed and of course, bushfires. On the flip side and despite the short season, we had one of busiest seasons in recent memory, and not only served our local community but have become part of a community some 12,000 kilometres away.

In our 113th season, we can proudly say that once again no lives were lost on North Steyne Beach. This is due to our exceptional training, highly vigilant lifesaving volunteers, teamwork with the Manly Council lifeguards and utmost dedication to the job at hand. Congratulations to our wonderful volunteers and contributing your time and energy for upholding this record.

For the fifth year in a row, our member numbers grew. This was mainly due to a big increase in our Nippers and general members. The increase of younger members certainly bodes well for the future of our Club.

## Board of Directors

After 4 years with Frank Traugott at the helm, I took on the role as President. Frank did a terrific job in laying the foundations for a well functioning team and ensuring a strong governance structure. Therefore, slotting into the role was relatively easy, and with old hands such as Tony Falzarano as Treasurer, Jack Sutherland, Deputy President, Dan Hillier as Captain, and Jodie Frazer as Youth Director plus others, we have a depth of experience matched by none.

It was great to welcome Trae Hare-Boyd as Chief Instructor and Cath Hillier as Secretary both of whom bring a range of new skills to the Board, along with some terrific new Assistant Directors in Jack Watt, Dannii Edwards, and Sarah Lally. With people on the Board spanning the ages of 20-83 years, we are lucky to have such tremendous diversity and a group of talented people who bring great ideas, energy, passion, as well as common sense to the running of North Steyne.

## Activities and Events

We kicked the season off with a sensational Back to the Beach party organised by Claire Oxlade, General Activities Director. With a best dressed patrol competition, there were some fantastic costumes, and we enjoyed delicious food, plenty of drink and an excellent band which rocked the hall. We had a great turnout of members and it was a fantastic and fun way to bring in the new season.

Our Nippers had a great season and they

competed strongly at carnivals, including at the NSW Junior State Championships with the biggest North Steyne Nipper representation in many years. Brian Mariotti, Junior Activities Director, and Hillary Burrows, Assistant Director, did a great job and have built a strong program.



A highlight of the season was the Nipper's beach and water carnival which North Steyne hosted in early December. Attended by some 450 competitors, it was an extremely well run event. It was particularly good to see a strong contingent of U8 competitors on the beach who gained some much needed experience which will be useful in years to come.

Once again our Ripper Nipper's program was highly successful. With 35 Rippers registered, each Sunday this great group of kids and their families participated in a range of skill development and fun activities on the beach. David Cowell, Marketing Director, but better known as Dave the Shark, ran a sensational program, and we are very proud to have such special kids and their families as part of North Steyne.



## Competition

Our competitors, ably led by Deb Foote, Competition Director, had success yet again in Champion Life Saver and the Patrol Competition. Big congratulations to all as we won a number of medals at both branch and state.

A special shout out to Joe Jenkins who brought home the state gold in U19s, as well as dominating his age group for the last four seasons.

Our boats followed suit and had a very good season with five crews competing. This included having a team in the George Bass surf boat marathon which unfortunately was called off after two days due to the bushfires devastating the South Coast. I would like to acknowledge all those surf lifesaving clubs that played a critical role in helping their local communities during the bushfires – an incredible effort.

North Steyne also stepped in to run the Australia Day Surf Boat Carnival, which was another highlight of the season. With boats and crews competing from all over the state, it was highly successful with perfect weather and enough surf to make all the races interesting. A special moment occurred with the raising of the oars to mark Australia Day celebrations.



## The Gaza Surf Project

In January, we welcomed two men from Palestine, Mohammed Saleh and Hasan Alhabil, to North Steyne to learn about surf lifesaving in order to establish a Nippers program and a fully-fledged surf lifesaving club on Gaza Beach. Now that they have returned to Gaza, their priority is establishing a Nippers program. We are proud to have been part of this effort, and we look forward to supporting



our sister club, The Gaza Beach Surf Life Saving Club, for many years to come.

Once again we had a visit from a fantastic group of kids from Warnambool SLSC who stayed at our Club over the Australia Day long week and competed in the local carnivals. It is a pleasure to have a close and long standing relationship with Warnambool, and we look forward to their visit every year.

Off the beach, we helped with the Sun Run in early February which raised important money for our Club. We also raised money at the beginning of the season for our drought-stricken farmers and in the new year contributed to the bushfire relief. Our BBQs once again brought in much needed money for the Club and thank you to all who served up some delicious food, particularly our wonderful A and A- teams. Our Clubroom was also very busy this season and thank you to all those who helped behind the bar, with Paul Mathew who kept everything under control.

This season we kicked off our building project and hope to present a building masterplan at the AGM in September 2020. Thanks to all those who completed our survey to help shape the future of our club.

To all our volunteers, members, patrons and sponsors, thank you for your contribution. Despite somewhat unusual circumstances, our extraordinary members have made a real difference and worked together to deliver a full program of activities all while keeping people safe on North Steyne Beach.

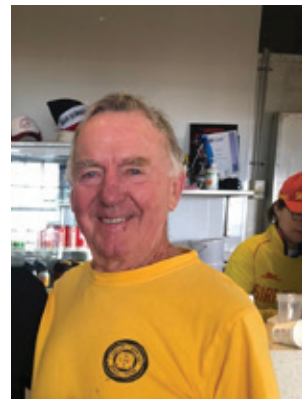
Unfortunately, our annual ocean swim had to be cancelled. It was all organised when we called it off so a big thank you to Bernie and Tracey who put so much effort into this event.

# Chief Instructor's Report

Through the 2019/20 season North Steyne has achieved many great feats within the education portfolio. This season we had a 100% competency rate for all candidates put to assessment. The North Steyne education team then surged forward with a new initiative resulting in the completion of 75% of the club's proficiencies achieved prior to the start of the season for Bronze, ARTC, Spinal and IRB Driver and Crew awards.

However, this season has been a challenge for all with the abrupt end to the season due to the COVID-19 pandemic and compulsory lockdown. The last Bronze group had to cease training. However, we can't let this dampen the success had at the start and during the season.

## Proficiencies

This season North Steyne had an amazing turnout in proficiencies. The education team and I decided to tackle the challenge of proficiencies in a new and inventive way. By conducting multiple proficiency sessions before the start of the season we were able to get through 75% of our returning patrolling members before the panic or gear inspection and commencement of the season.

Moving forward with technology, we did trial the Assessing App but unfortunately due to some unforeseen complications that were experienced not only by North Steyne but throughout the Branch, we had to come up with our own tracking and booking system.

We set proficiency dates and undertook the trial of a new booking system which allowed members to book a specific time slot to do their proficiency meaning that the Endorsed Delegates, Training Officers and Assessors had an accurate record of completed proficiencies and were able to plan logistically, in terms of gear and equipment, club space, personnel and water safety requirements. All in all, I feel this new method was a success and will be continually improved upon in the upcoming season.

## Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC)

The SRC marks the graduation of an U14 Nipper into cadetship and the start of their patrolling journey with SLISA. This season, 16 members of the U14's undertook the challenge of obtaining their SRC in December 2019 under the guidance of our newly endorsed Training Officer, Jodie Frazer, who did an amazing job pushing these kids to excel in their own unique ways.

Throughout their course these kids, and a couple of parents, got to learn and test their knowledge of

the surf through many different teaching and assessment tools.

Excitingly, the start of the 2020/21 season will see the SRC award have some dramatic changes from previous years. Many thanks to Jodie Frazer for taking on the challenge of this course and congratulations on such a great result.

## Bronze Medallion

The Bronze Medallion is the principle to Surf Life Saving. The Bronze Medallion award is available to any person over the age of 15. It is the major step into the vast array of the Life Saving community and one of the best things you will ever do.

Through this season 41 members achieved their Bronze Medallion. The training of these members was lead by head trainer Tracey Hare-Boyd with the support of myself and our new member and probationary Training Officer Hanna Clare.

The Bronze candidates ranged from school aged children to Nipper Parents and of course members of our community. Congratulations to all those who have achieved their Bronze Medallion this year and I look forward to seeing you further your SLISA career as you choose to upskill and obtain other awards

## School Programs

This year unfortunately we were unable to run the Redlands Surf Lifesaving program due to the absence of the Redlands Lifesaving Co-Ordinator who was on Long Service Leave. There was however, demand for the course due to the high standing that North Steyne has with Redlands.

We decided to run an independent bronze program outside of the school. This group consisted mostly Redlands' students who heard from their peers



who currently patrol, how important lifesaving is in their growth and development. Congratulations Tracey Hare-Boyd on achieving this great result after training and participating in the Redlands program for over 10 years.

The St. Ignatius College, Riverview, SLS program was also hosted again at North Steyne this season. This season, we ran the Riverview SRC and Bronze program within the school's Term 4. Training took on a similar scope as the Redlands program with dry training taking place at the school and the wet components on a Saturday morning commencing at 7:00am! Students also had the opportunity to split the Saturday morning session into a wet and dry session when needed. This allowed the students to take in as much information as possible in a short time frame. All the students who attended the program achieved either their SRC or Bronze Medallion by the end of 4th term and went straight into patrolling for North Steyne.



### **Advanced Resuscitation Techniques (ARTC)**

The ARTC course is an advanced course on the Bronze Medallion and one of the harder dry assessments to participate in. The award is theory and dry practical based and tests knowledge in CPR with an extended knowledge and use of defib, oxygen and concentrates on teamwork and the use of such equipment.

We were in the process of organising a combined club course with our neighbours, Manly and Queenscliff, but unfortunately due to COVID-19 restrictions and early season end, we were not able to commence the training.

### **First Aid**

First aid is the most practiced skill on the beach and accounts for the majority of our statistics and one of the most important awards a surf lifesaver can do. This year we continued to provide First Aid courses for our members along with a Cadet

specific course along with many of our members completing their 3 yearly refreshers for those of us whose award was due to expire.

Due to the COVID-19 restrictions, many of the First Aid awards that were due to expire during the early closure of the Clubs have been extended by SLISA and we thank them for acknowledging the need for the extension giving Club members the opportunity to not have their qualifications lapse under circumstances that are beyond their control.

### **IRB Awards**

The IRB award comes via two awards, the Silver Medallion IRB Driver and IRB Crew certificate. This year, under the guidance of Richard Donaldson, we have successfully put through 17 Crews and 5 new Drivers.

IRB is a portfolio we will be looking at more closely in an attempt to provide one driver for each patrol and take the burden off the few drivers we have



within the Club. In the upcoming season we would like to introduce two new probationary trainers to share the load with our current Training Officers and assist in running more courses to recruit more Drivers and Crewman.

### **Silver Medallion Beach Management**

The SM Beach Management course is a Branch facilitated course. This season, we were lucky to host a Branch course at North Steyne. Thanks to Tracey Hare-Boyd, Facilitator for offering to run the course at North Steyne enabling three of our members to achieve this award. The Beach Management award is effectively a Patrol Captain's qualification training course where participants learn incident management, search and rescue, and critical incidents including foundational knowledge of Policies, Procedures and some Legislation.

### **Gold Medallion**

The Gold Medallion is the most advanced lifesaving award. Members obtaining their Gold



Medallion must undergo a grueling physical mission to achieve it. Once you have obtained this award, Gold Medallion holders must repeat the mission as a proficiency to be able to maintain their award. This season, we had one new Gold Medallion Award recipient.

## **Thank you**

I would like to end this report by giving thanks to the many club members who gave up their time to further improve their surf lifesaving skills, complete their various proficiencies, upskill and undertake different challenges within the education portfolio.

I would like to sincerely thank the North Steyne education team for giving up countless hours of their time to support myself and the Club through training and assessments. Special mention and thanks to Richard Donaldson, Joe Mastrangelo and Tracey Hare-Boyd. These three people have been instrumental in the coordination of North Steyne's education portfolio year after year.

I would also like to congratulate Richard Donaldson on being a SLSSNB Training Officer finalist in the 2019/20 Awards of Excellence. # Club Captain's Report

The 2019/2020 Surf Lifesaving Season provided North Steyne with a totally different season to previous years, the global pandemic impacted our patrolling season significantly and required the ending of our season early, it hindered on our ability to use the club house, to train and compete. I think you would agree that it has been a challenging and frustrating season. However, as is the nature of Team North Steyne it was great to see the members pull together and look out for their community and club members, putting safety first. This was both the physical safety of our members pre lock down, with the club on the front foot, closing down early to protect our members safety and over the lock down period focusing of the mental health of members with Zoom exercise classes or phone calls for a RUOK. One statistic that I am as Club Captain proud of is that again 'No Lives Lost' protecting our community and visitors, either local or from around the globe.

During the season it was once again fantastic to witness and be involved with our highly trained and dedicated lifesavers go about the business of patrolling our patch. Our team is inspiring, whilst they worked hard on the beach, in preparing for patrols, patrolling and helping around the club, they are always being ready to go above and beyond the basic requirements and that is what makes the difference with this team. Whilst this is the serious side of patrolling it was also great to see the patrols still having fun and lightening up the experience. It was brilliant to observe the more senior members impart their expert knowledge and beach craft to the newer members, and it was also great to see the newer younger members teach the senior operators a few things or two as well, like using the new Surf App!

This season our Patrolling Team Members of 250 patrolled a total of 6,017 cumulative hours. The total season hours were down by around 2000 hours this year over previous ones due to COVID. Given this impact it is still interesting to note that there were still 37 members who patrolled over 40 hours this year. Additionally there were 33 members who patrolled in the 30 hours plus bracket that would likely have patrolled over 40 hours had not COVID stopped the season. Well done all!

As always, our team provided quality and professional lifesaving services to all visitors on North Steyne beach. The success of this season and all previous seasons is the ongoing contribution of our patrolling members. Our members work together in a team focused way, for their own patrols, and the many other patrols that they help volunteer or sub with over the season.

I thank these members and their families who support and understand the value of the service that they provide. Thank you for your commitment to keeping our beach safe this season and in future seasons.



Throughout the season we conducted 27 rescues with tubes, IRB, boards or with no gear, which is a reduction from the previous year as expected given the early close to the season. Additionally we provided 107 first aids. Our Team members undertook nearly 1000 preventative actions which is a significant decrease over the previous season. Again the statistics are difficult to read given this years shortened season. However, as we know preventing rescues before occur is a sign that our lifesavers are doing their job well. Well done to all our PC's driving the message to your patrols on prevention is better than rescues.

This year we hosted Nippers and a Boat Carnival on our Beach which was a brilliant experience, again showing the best of our members pulling together to get it up and running on a truncated timeline. We also hosted two Palestinian Lifeguards for training in the SRC and Bronze Medallion for the Gaza Project. Unfortunately due to the COVID-19 outbreak we were unable to run our annual Ocean Swim which was disappointing for all involved, however we will look to run it again soon!.

These events do not occur without the fantastic and ongoing support of the North Steyne community who go above and beyond their normal patrol duties to help out.





## Proficiencies

At season launch the hard work was put in and we again had a successful gear inspection, and thank you to all involved with this process, then the season began with the challenge of ensuring we have proficiencies for all patrolling members. Multiple proficiencies were conducted across all awards. A huge thanks to Trae Hare-Boyd, Chief Training Officer, who organised our trainers and assessors for each proficiency session and we were able to ensure we had the bulk of the members proficient very early in the season. Thanks also to Tracey Hare-Boyd, Paul Mathew, Shannon Job, Keith Abraham, Joe Mastrangelo, James Purvis, Deb Foote, Richard Donaldson and our Patrol Captain's for their hard work in ensuring everyone's skills remained up to date.

## Patrols

North Steyne's patrols are the core of what we do ensuring that Team North Steyne is on the beach protecting the public, without functioning and competent patrols we are not a surf club, and without our members we cannot patrol.

I would publicly like to thank all our brilliant Patrols and PC's who manage them, thank you all for your service. These members did a great job keeping on top of maintenance considering some of the challenges we faced this year and were integral in IRB education throughout the season. Importantly they also helped ensure that we were able to provide drivers throughout the season when the shortages arose.

Last but not least, James Purvis's & Jack Watt's assistance and support as Vice-Captains was invaluable in ensuring the lifesaving section ran smoothly again. I cannot thank both enough for the effort over many seasons for James and this season for Jack in this role. I look forward to working with both outstanding members in the future.

# IRB Captain's Report

The 2019/2020 season was one to remember with many positives unfortunately brought to an early close by the Covid-19 pandemic. Due to this, the IRB section did not grow much this season, but there were many highlights that made the season one to remember. A large milestone for the North Steyne IRB section was the purchase of 2 new hulls, 1 Achilles and 1 Thundercat, that are currently in the production process, as well as the purchase of a new engine that will ensure we have reliable engines on the beach every weekend. These new hulls will increase the reliability of our IRB section and decrease repair needs. I was unfortunately at university during gear inspection, but all engines and hulls were prepared for the day and therefore was a very successful day, with minimal changes required.

This season we had a few members gain their IRB Drivers Silver Medallion including Dan Hillier, Jack Watt and Joe Purvis as well as a few members gain their IRB Crew certificate. This number is significantly lower from other seasons, but due to COVID-19 we were unable to complete courses towards the end of the season. But with the introduction of members being able to complete their crew course in conjunction with bronze certificates, I am expecting that next season there will be an increase in new crew members, which will hopefully in turn increase the number of new drivers.

This year North Steyne hosted two major carnivals being the North Steyne Nipper Carnival and the Surfboat section of the Australia Day Carnival. This meant that the IRB section had to provide over four boats at all times as water safety to all nippers and surfboat rowers. We were required to borrow boats from Manly, South Curl Curl and Queenscliff to ensure that we had enough resources for the water as well as back up hulls and engines in case of emergency or mechanical issues. We were very thankful towards these clubs for assisting us in successfully providing water safety for the entirety of the two carnival weekends. I would really like to extend my appreciation to everyone who assisted and put their hands up for shifts at the Australia Day carnival as well as branch and state carnivals. They were two very long weekends of full days and without the assistance from all drivers and crews to fill the long days of water safety, these carnivals would not have been so successful.

For NSW State Champs, North Steyne were required to fill an IRB for a shift, and without the

support of the surfboat rowers filling these shifts while competing, all competitors would have been pulled out of competition. This too, at the Branch Nipper Carnival, where we were required to fill a shift to ensure that our nippers could compete. The shift was filled quickly and I thank every volunteer again. Big thank you to Jack Watt and Trae-Hare Boyd who responded to a boat in distress at Freshwater during early morning set up of the Nipper Carnival. Responding to Surfcom's call for assistance and responding within minutes.

This season, there was a group of members excited and keen to start up a IRB Racing team. They trained hard most weekends and kept everyone involved, but unfortunately due to not being able to find a coach and COVID-19, this season was not the season to start for our team, but hopefully next season the team will be able to race.

I would like to extend my thank you to Richard Donaldson, Trae Hare-Boyd and Jack Watt. Without their help, engines would not have been fixed quickly and shifts at many carnivals would not have been filled. Their generosity to the club does not go unnoticed.

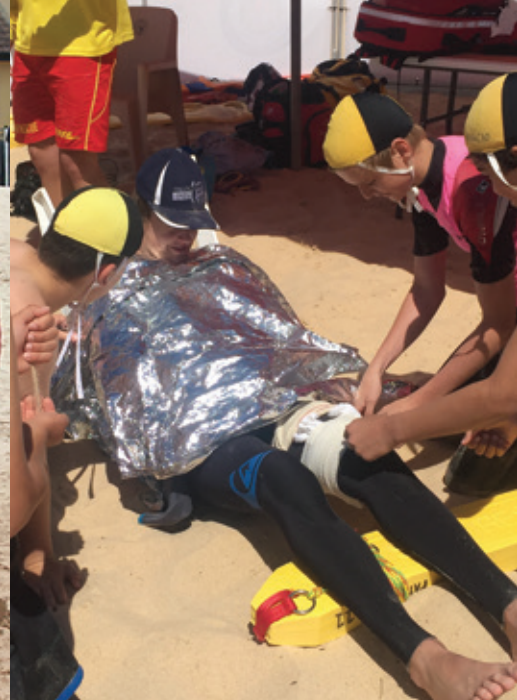

## Fundraising

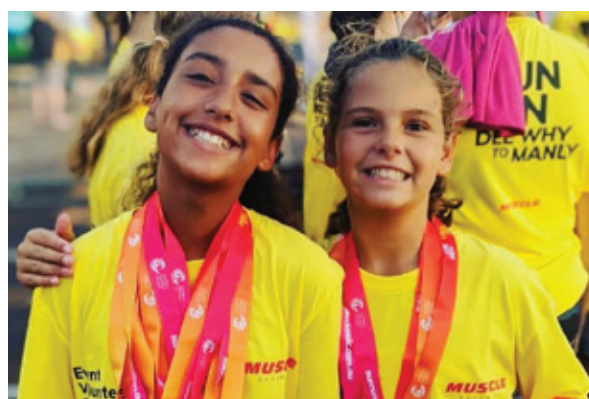

# Gaza Lifesaving Project

In January 2020, we had the pleasure of hosting two men from Palestine, Mohammed (Mo) Saleh and Hasan Alhabil, to learn about surf lifesaving in order to establish a Nippers program and a fully-fledged surf lifesaving club on Gaza Beach.

While at North Steyne, Mo and Hasan participated on patrols, undertook board and surf rescue training, gained CPR and first aid skills, observed Nippers to find out about how to run a Nippers program, and learnt how to manage and administer a surf lifesaving club. They also undertook Bronze Medallion training with Mohammed obtaining his Surf Rescue Certificate and Hasan achieving his Bronze Medallion. Importantly, as well, Mo and Hasan were able to understand and embrace the Australian surf lifesaving culture.

Now that they have returned to Gaza, their priority is establishing a Nippers program which can hopefully be run this year. The next phase of the project will be to establish a fully-fledged surf lifesaving club, the Gaza Beach Surf Life Saving Club, and be accepted for membership by the International Life Saving Federation.

There are several drownings in Gaza each year, and with high unemployment and mass poverty, surf lifesaving will provide not only valuable services in keeping people safe on the beach, but be an important outlet for youth to be involved in a sporting, social and community activities. The Nippers program, initially for kids U6-U10, will be open to both boys and girls who will undertake all training and activities together. Co-education programs such as this are very rare in Gaza, so the Gaza Beach Nippers program will be breaking new ground.

North Steyne was approached to become involved with this project by the Northern Beaches Committee for Palestine which aspires to bring Australian surf lifesaving to Gaza. The project to bring Palestinians to Australia to learn about surf lifesaving has been almost 5 years in the making, with North Steyne being involved for the last 3 years.

It is interesting to note that there is a strong tie with surf lifesaving in Gaza as Australian troops stationed there during World War II held carnivals on the beach. We hope that we can restore some of this tradition, while improving the lives of young people and keeping people safe on the beach in Gaza.

During their stay, we received significant media interest from national and international news outlets. This included coverage on SBS nightly news and website, Peter FitzSimons' column in the Sydney Morning Herald, The Guardian and various surfing magazines. The story has also been syndicated in Arab speaking publications.

A big thank you to all that made Mo and Hasan's stay a successful. A particular thanks to Brian Mariotti for putting together such a good Nipper's program, Paul Mathew for showing them some of the ropes, Trae Hare-Boyd for providing training and Jack Watt for providing training, encouragement and translation services to ensure they received their bronze medallion and SRC. It was a true team effort and we are very proud to be part of it. We will continue to support our sister club, the Gaza Beach Surf Life Saving Club, for many years to come.

Our lifesaving team began branch championships with good performances in theory and resuscitation but a major storm caused the cancellation of the remainder of SNB Branch championships when Queenscliff beach washed away and all beaches were covered in vast amounts of debris.

We were lucky that all competitors from Juniors through to Masters were able to compete in NSW State championships but the early shutdown of the lifesaving season due to the global Covid-19 pandemic resulted in cancellation of both our club championships and the Aussies. A frustration, and disappointment for all those who had been training hard and preparing for all levels of competition. Lifesaving.

This season saw the coming together of a new Open Patrol Competition team (pictured below) who surprised themselves with an excellent performance at State championships to snag a bronze medal. With further training particularly in the scenario we may aim even higher next year.



Once again our Champion Lifesavers performed very creditably bringing home one gold and two bronze medals with all competitors in the points.

Sarah Lally was our only representative at the Freshwater Masters carnival in November where the surf was a little challenging.

Kinder conditions welcomed two teams for the Sir Adrian Curlewis Twilight Masters carnival at Palm Beach. Always a very fun late afternoon teams

# Surf Boats

The 2020 season continued to build on the momentum of 2019 with five competitive crews including two masters. Over the course of 2020 we trained and certified a new sweep from our existing squad and recruited four new members to three competition crews. Away from the surf, another two development crews were formed in the key junior demographics of U19 males and U23 Females. North Steyne competition participation was also up this season with representation at local Branch, Ocean Thunder, Cronulla, ASRL, Pacific Palms and State carnivals despite the cancellation of Branch Championships and Aussies carnivals this season due the Global COVID pandemic.

2020 started off with some strong performance from the reserve women's crew, the Tiger Lilies, at the local branch carnivals at Newport and Bilgola while our open male's crew, the Nomads, kicked off their Ocean Thunder campaign with the first dead heat for first place in OT history.

As the season moved on into December and all things turned Christmas the boat crews headed down to the Cronulla with the ladies again making the semi-final and the master's headed down to Bateman's Bay to begin the epic biennial race that is the George Bass Marathon. At this point the surf boat season began to feel the affects of extreme climatic events and the George Bass was cancelled on the second day due to historical bushfires wreaking havoc along the NSW coast and beyond.

Then in January, a ray of light, North Steyne hosted the Manly Australia Day surf boat carnival. Not even the reserve men's crew breaking an oar on the start line could dampen everyone's spirits as the whole club came together to put on a successful two-day event.

The North Steyne Surf boat squad returned to southern NSW and Mollymook beach for the ASRL in February for some big wave action then onto State and Pacific Palms with some impressive round robin results setting things up for a promising Aussies campaign and end to the Ocean Thunder series. Unfortunately, this was not to be the case as the COVID-19 pandemic ended the season early leaving a season unfinished but with some great experiences for the squad along the way as we look to go into 2021.

Despite an early end to the season in March, we had a good year financially. We made a net profit of \$57,777, which is only slightly less than last season and our second-best financial result over the last 5 years. We also increased our cash at bank by \$139,922. Our total accumulated earnings increased by \$66,656 to a total of \$754,555 as a result of the net profit and the allocation of reserves to the Special Purpose Funds. Having a strong balance sheet and cash position will be crucial in ensuring sustainability during this uncertain time.

Our total income was \$285,525. This was a decrease from last season due to a decline in donations and sponsorships with events not being held, and the lack of a major donation which we received in 2019 for the new surf boat. There was also a decrease in grant monies received as we did not spend as much on building upgrades as we did in the previous season. Conversely, and most pleasingly, membership revenue was up by almost 10%. We also received Government support in the form of JobKeeper and a cashflow boost which contributed to our positive bottom line.

Our fundraising efforts were very positive with an increase in both BBQ and bar revenue. We also held two very successful carnivals which provided a combined surplus of \$10,908. This helped to offset the loss of revenue from our ocean swim which had to be cancelled at the last minute due to COVID-19.

Operating expenses were substantially down from the previous year, mainly due to the fact that we did not have any major expenditure on the building and some of our planned events did not take place. Most other expenses remained the same with slight increases in employee costs and slight decreases in competition, education and lifesaving expenses.

Looking forward, we are expecting challenging times ahead. There is no doubt our Club will need to operate differently with the current restrictions due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Over the offseason, we have put in place a number of measures to safeguard our members and ensure compliance with all prescribed health regulations. This had meant additional expenditure on cleaning, cleaning products and other systems to ensure we are COVID safe. Hopefully these measures are temporary. Regardless we have established a strong foundation, and no doubt with the support of members and our community will have a very positive 2020/2021 season.

## Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 31 May 2020

### Note 1 - Summary of significant accounting policies

The following explains the significant accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the financial statements. Unless otherwise stated, such accounting policies were also adopted in the corresponding reporting period.

#### General

The financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial report preparation requirements of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission and Charitable Fundraising Act. The board has determined that the club is not a reporting entity. North Steyne Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a not-for-profit entity for the purpose of preparing the financial statements.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 and the following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report.

#### Basis of accounting

The statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values, or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

#### Registration fees

All registration fees are brought to account in the year to which they apply as and when received from the members. The capitation fees, due to Surf Life Saving New South Wales Inc and Sydney Northern Beaches Surf Life Saving, are remitted as and when invoiced and shown as a separate expenditure item.

#### Donations and sponsorship income

Donations & sponsorship income is recognised when amounts are received or receivable.

#### Grants

Grants are recognised in the same period as the related expense or asset is recognised. Grants received in advance are shown as deferred income.

#### Government Assistance

Government assistance represents the Boosting Cash Flow and JobKeeper payments received in response to COVID-19.

#### Cash at bank

Cash at bank and term deposits represents monies deposited with the Commonwealth Bank of Australia and Bank of Queensland.

#### Inventories

Inventories have been valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.



## Property, plant and equipment

- i. Property, plant and equipment are carried at cost, independent of directors' valuations. All assets are depreciated over their useful life
- ii. Over the years, the club has collected considerable memorabilia. These memorabilia were originally recorded at a nominal value but has subsequently been fully depreciated to zero - hence the financial accounts do not ascribe any value to memorabilia assets
- iii. The cost of the day to day servicing of property, plant and equipment is recognised in the profit and loss as incurred
- iv. Net depreciation and amortisation rates used for each major class of asset are:

## Note 2 – Related parties

Transactions with committee members or their committee-member related entity occurred within a normal member or supplier relationship on terms and conditions no more favourable than those which it is reasonable to expect that the entity would have adopted if dealing with the committee member or their committee-member at arms-length in the same circumstance.

## Note 3 – Segment information

The club derives revenue primarily from its members, sponsors and fundraising activities to support its role in providing beach life saving services and operations. The club's activities are principally carried out at North Steyne Beach, located in NSW.

## Note 4 – Subsequent events

The continuing COVID-19 pandemic and related restrictions will impact our operations due to government mandated compliance requirements and additional WHS measures. It is expected that revenue will also be impacted across a number of areas, but some of the revenue shortfall will be offset by COVID related grants and government support. North Steyne is a COVID safe compliant business.

Our Lifesaving Services Agreement is on similar terms and levels as this past season and we continue to operate under the same terms and conditions as per our license agreement, now expired.

## Note 5 – NSW Government grant for club facilities upgrades

Miscellaneous building upgrades were undertaken with funding applied from NSW Government grants. Several projects were not carried out due to COVID-19 restrictions.

**Independent Auditor's Report**

**Opinion**
