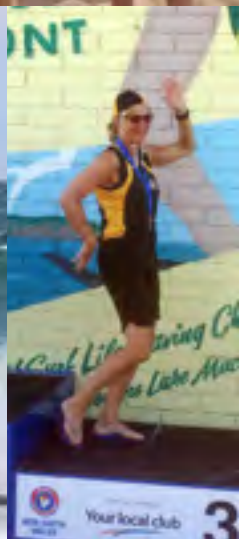

President's Foreword - Frank Traugott



Our 110th anniversary season has been outstanding. There were many highlights – a gala dinner, visit by the Premier, display of our heritage, recognition for our members, support for a world surfboard riding event, 20th annual ocean swim, hosting a carnival, 10% increase in membership and a life saving rescue.

The rescue was a remarkable one. At 8.30am on 5 January

2018, a 65 year old man had a heart attack whilst swimming at Shelly Beach. It was out of hours, away from our beach, when two of our best trained members were first on the scene. Tracey Hare-Boyd and son Trae Hare-Boyd dragged the man out of the water. Tracey immediately began CPR whilst Trae ran to Manly LSC to get a defibrillator.

The man's heart had stopped for 30 minutes. Together with other medical specialists they brought him back to life. Tracey and Trae, the right people on the spot at the right time, were awarded the branch and state Rescue of the Month for January 2018. James Griffin, MP for Manly, mentioned the rescue in the NSW Parliament.

Our lifesavers were also excelling back on our beach. Our record remains intact: no lives lost whilst North Steyne SLSC members have been on patrol in 110 years. This is supported by our tagline: North Steyne SLSC proudly serving the community on North Steyne Beach for 110 years. Dan Hillier had a great first year as Club Captain. He was a deserved Clubperson of the Year, and Tony Falzarano was a deserved winner of my President's Award.

It was a busy year also for events celebrating our 110 years. The highlight was our 110th Black & Gold Anniversary Dinner at St. Patrick's Estate, Manly on 4th November 2017. Chris Stewart, our "master of ceremonies" and radiant in red, along with Katy Gompes and Claire Oxlade organised a classy and fun event. The Premier, Gladys Berejiklian, visited the club the next morning as part of our celebrations. She met with members and Nippers, and with Stephen Pearce, CEO of SLNSW, awarded the National Medal for Service to 3 of our members.

On 12th November 2017 we hosted a successful junior beach only carnival for the branch.

From 9th February to 8th March 2018 we lent our clubhouse and beach to the Vissla Sydney Surf Pro. Large crowds came to North Steyne to watch this world class surfboard riding event at a designated world surfing reserve with good surf and perfect weather conditions. It was part of what was to become our "endless summer".



On 25th March 2018 we held our 20th annual ocean swim. It was one of our best. The sun was out, and the numbers were up. It was fascinating to watch the wise older swimmers enter the water 200m north of the pipe to catch the rip out.

On 5th May 2018 we opened the Club to the public on Heritage Day. We showed memorabilia, had panel discussions with life members, told stories and celebrated our long history of serving the community. We welcomed our special guest, Rochelle Nichols, author of Hell and High Water, to talk about one of North Steyne's most famous members Cecil Healy.

This season was also significant for 3 other events which I attended that honoured Cecil Healy, 100 years after he died on the battlefield in Somme, France on 29th August 1918. On 22nd February, Northern Beaches Council named the new pool after John Devitt AM and Cecil Healy. On 22nd April, Rochelle's book Hell and High Water was launched at Queenscliff SLSC and Cecil Healy was honoured at the Manly LSC/ Manly Surf Club Anzac Day ceremony.

David Cowell and Tracey Hare-Boyd were also honoured this season. David was named NSW Government Volunteer of Year, Sydney North and Tracey was a finalist in the Rotary International, Inspirational Woman of Year. David and Tracey were also given an Outstanding Community Service award at the inaugural Northern Beaches Council Australia Day celebration. These awards were 2 of only 10 for the entire northern beaches region. Congratulations and thanks.

There were many other outstanding achievements this season: Joe Jenkin's bronze medal at Aussies; "Our extraordinary league of [six] gentlemen" for their collective 400 years of volunteer service; our board also deserves thanks for their stability and commitment. Our Presentation Night and grant applications were other successes.

During the season we also supported a number of charities and events including the Sun Run, the Cerebral Palsy Alliance 20/ Twenty Challenge, the Special Olympics "Soar and Roar", Bear Cottage and a church group who provided free monthly meals from the surf club hall to those in need.

It is with pleasure that I present the 111th Annual Report to the members, sponsors and friends of North Steyne Surf Life Saving Club for the 2017/18 lifesaving season.

I am particularly impressed with our young females who are so full of enthusiasm for our Club and who won a number of major awards at Presentation Night. In my opinion, bringing women into surf lifesaving certainly saved it. There is no doubt that surf lifesaving would have been significantly diminished today, or even non-existent, had that not happened.

It is easy being the Deputy President under President Frank Traugott as he certainly takes a lot on. His leadership has been outstanding, and thanks to him we have accomplished so much this season.

I would like to encourage absent life members, disengaged distinguished and outstanding service members and all past members to consider returning to the Club. See you back on the beach.

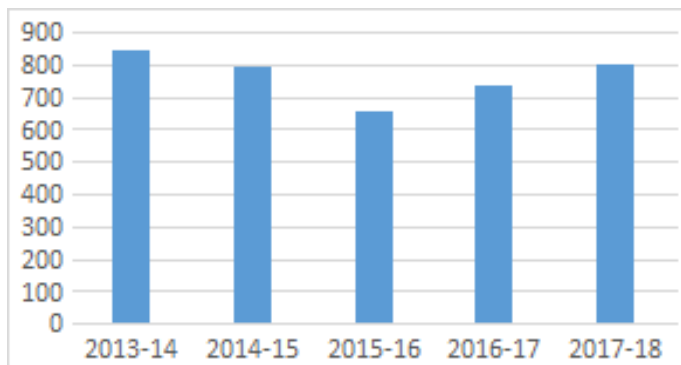

Secretary's Report - Christine Gibbs Stewart

The 2017-2018 season for North Steyne has been exceptional as we celebrated our 110th anniversary. A great deal of effort and time was spent planning, organising and then enjoying all related activities. The early part of the season was very much focused on the 110th anniversary dinner, and what an excellent night that was! The event was sold out and we enjoyed a great evening with exceptional speeches, great services at an iconic venue, plenty of laughs and fun on the dance floor. A big thanks to Claire Oxlade and Katy Gompes who used their many talents to ensure that the dinner was a big success.

I am very pleased to report that membership numbers increased this season to 813 total. This is a 10% increase from last season, and the second year that we have experienced a growth in member numbers. Membership categories that grew included General Members, Nippers, Active Seniors and Youth (15-18 years). It was great to see an increase in Nippers and Youth which is very important for our future. It is also great that we had a slight increase in the Active Senior category as this is the majority of our volunteers and the backbone of our patrols.



Only a few clubs on the Northern Beaches experienced

membership growth and it is great to be one of them!

Once again much of our discussion during Board meetings was on the importance of our members and ensuring strong retention. Our 110th anniversary celebrations tried to include all members, no matter what the age. It was great to be recognized by so many for what we have achieved over our 110 years. Those long serving and life members are to be congratulated for all they have contributed to the Club. They are role models for all our younger members, and we should be proud that we have several people who have been members for 50 years plus, not to mention 75!

We held 10 Board meetings over the season. They were well attended with all areas actively represented. Frank Traugott's leadership continues to be outstanding and we have a cohesive and productive Board. Jack Sutherland also provides tremendous guidance drawing on his many years of experience at the Club.

Chief Instructor's Report - Kyra Jenkins



Core training

Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC)

Thirty One (31) young North Steyne members completed their SRC this season. The SRC is undertaken when members are in the U14s. This award marks the end of their Nippers journey, a graduation of sorts, and their transition into the senior club and the Cadet program.

During training sessions, it was amazing to see so many Nippers who previously had been nervous and lacking confidence work successfully as a team and coach each other through the water and theory components. These new SRCs were posted to patrols across the Club. Given the high standard shown this year, I'm confident that North Steyne will continue to fulfill our responsibilities on patrol.

The group represents the future of our patrolling strength, and please join me in welcoming them onto patrol and encourage them as they continue to gain new experiences and develop their skills. A special thanks to this year's SRC trainers, Tracey Hare-Boyd assisted by Trae Hare-Boyd, and the SRC coordinator, Brian Mariotti.

Bronze Medallion

The Bronze Medallion is the entry level lifesaving qualification. It provides the basic skills that all other courses build upon, and as such it is our most important award.

This season 54 people achieved their Bronze Medallion, which is a great result. I had the privilege to conduct and assist with some of the many courses we ran and it was amazing to see the candidates grow and gain confidence in their skills throughout the course, particularly those that were new to the Club and had not previously held an SRC. These members are now on patrol with North Steyne.

School Programs

The SCEGGS Redlands Bronze program was also held again this season. Redlands Bronze runs on a Wednesday morning at the school campus starting at 7:00am during the 4th term. Wet training runs on a Sunday afternoon. This year, 17 students participated in the program. Trainers were Tracey Hare-Boyd and Trae Hare-Boyd.

Higher awards

Advanced Resuscitation Techniques (ARTC)

ARTC is one of the most challenging awards offered by Surf Life Saving. It builds heavily upon skills learnt in the Bronze course and adds new ones to achieve a higher level of competency. It was great to see so many ready to take on the challenge. This season we congratulate 5 new members who have achieved this award.

First Aid

Performing first aid is a major component of our patrols, and first aid courses are very important as they provide a higher level of skill for patrolling members. Having members with more in-depth knowledge on the beach is essential and helps patrols and first aid situations run smoothly. This season we had 35 members successfully complete the first aid certificate, many of them Cadets. Congratulations to all members who completed the course this season.

IRB Awards

The IRB represents the most important rescue tool that a patrol possesses. Its flexibility, speed and maneuverability makes it useful in a wide variety of situations including rescues in the break, search and rescue operations and providing water patrols and surveillance.

The IRB Crew Course provides candidates the skills to crew the IRB in a range of surf conditions. Over the season we ran 3 IRB Crew Courses with trainers Richard Donaldson and Matt Chapman. It is encouraging to see that we have gained 19 new crew. Congratulations to all new crew.

The IRB Driver Course extends a crew persons skills to provide them with the skills to drive the IRB in a range of surf conditions, implement patient pickups and direct the crew person. It is an incredibly valuable award to have on the beach and this season we added 1 new driver.

Spinal Management

Spinal Management is an incredibly valuable higher award that teaches candidates how to properly maintain and care for someone with a suspected spinal injury. This season North Steyne was fortunate enough to host a spinal management course with 16 people gaining the spinal management award.

Other Awards

We had 2 members complete the Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue Course. This course teaches candidates how to deal with



search and rescue situations. We also had 2 members complete their RWC Operators qualification this season which is a great achievement for these members and the Club. In addition, North Steyne also had 8 people complete their Beach Management Certificate this season. Congratulations to everyone who achieved these higher awards.

Proficiencies

Proficiencies are always a hectic and logistically challenging time of the year, and the beginning of the season was no different. Through everyone's hard work we were able to have the vast majority of members deemed proficient and ready to patrol for another season. Thanks to all members who took the time to do their proficiency, and thanks to all our delegates and assessors who assisted with running proficiencies.

Compliance

Aside from training, there are numerous compliance requirements each season. We held Education Panel meetings and the re-endorsement process, and we passed our gear inspection at the beginning of the season, which is a huge undertaking every year. North Steyne also provided assessors who gave up their time to assist with gear inspections through the Sydney Northern Beaches Branch.

The Importance of Trainers and Assessors

North Steyne is known for the high level of individual skills of our members. To maintain this, an experienced and well-trained Education Team is paramount. The North Steyne Education Team is dedicated to providing opportunities to engage in award training, either core or higher awards, for all club members. The Education Team is also committed to growth, and with this in mind, I would encourage all of you to consider being a trainer as I can honestly say that being a trainer is one of the most rewarding experiences I have had in Surf Life Saving, and I would encourage anyone who is



thinking about giving it a go to talk to anyone on the Education Team. This season we had 2 new trainers (1 full trainer and 1 probationary trainer) join the Education Team and several probationary trainers are continuing to work towards their endorsement. Thanks to all those involved in mentoring these new trainers.

The other component of education is assessing and North Steyne is dedicated to growing our assessor team by encouraging existing trainers and future trainers to consider moving into assessing roles. This helps to ease the burden on our more experienced assessors and it would be great to see some of the new trainers gain the assessor qualification over the next couple of seasons. We had 4 members complete their Certificate IV in Training & Assessment - Joe Mastrangelo, David Vinson, Tracey Hare-Boyd and Frank Traugott.

Thanks to everyone in the Education Team this season for all the hard work and effort you have put in this season, and in particular Tracey Hare-Boyd and Frank Traugott for their assistance. Thank you to David Vinson, Assistant Chief Instructor, for his work in the first half of this season.

the success of this season was reliant on the contribution of our patrolling members, and their understanding families. Thank you for your commitment to keeping our beach safe this season.

Throughout the season we conducted 42 rescues with tubes, using the IRB, boards or with no gear, which is a reduction from the previous year. Additionally we provided 121 first aids. Members undertook 5133 preventative actions which is an increase over the previous season. I am pleased to note the high number of preventative actions and the correlation to the small number of rescues – preventing rescues before they need to occur is a sign that our lifesavers are doing their job well.

It was a very busy season, with the Vissla Sydney Surf Pro replacing the Australian Open of Surfing and other community and Club events such as the 20/Twenty Challenge Cerebral Palsy Alliance Swim and, of course, our annual Ocean Swim which was held in very trying conditions with large numbers of participants. The number of members who volunteered to be involved in these extra events, going above and beyond their normal patrol duties to lend a hand, was very impressive and a testament to the nature and quality of members at North Steyne. We couldn't run these events without you – thank you.

Proficiencies

After a successful gear inspection, and thank you to all involved, the season began with proficiencies for all patrolling members. Over 250 proficiencies were conducted across all awards. A huge thanks to Kyra Jenkins, Chief Training Officer, who organised our trainers and assessors for each proficiency session. Thanks also to Tracey Hare-Boyd, Paul Mathew, Shannon Job, Keith Abraham, Frank Traugott, Joe Mastrangelo, James Purvis, Deb Foote, Richard Donaldson, Kyra Jenkins, Matthew Chapman, Dannii Edwards and David Vinson for their hard work in ensuring

everyone's skills remained up to date. As always there are challenges getting our members proficient and something we need to continue to enhance year on year, however, as noted the effort this year was fantastic.

Patrols

North Steyne's patrols were, as history has shown, excellent again this season. Any critical incidents were dealt with quickly and calmly, and in a professional manner. Three (3) of our 14 patrols had new patrol captains, with all the new captains doing an exceptional job of keeping the patrols running smoothly throughout this transition. Thank you to Ryan Bogatez & Jeff Brown, Mark Stewart, Ella Falzarano, Nick Carrington, Dannii Edwards, Jo Cooper, Harry Hickey, Danny Gompes, Paul Mathew, Tim Platt, James Purvis, David Cowell, Tracey Hare-Boyd and Bernie Burrows for their dedication to ensuring our patrols run smoothly.



I would like to thank Maxine Peacock-Smith who again expertly compiled our patrol roster. Additionally, our IRB section was well looked after by our IRB Captain Matthew Chapman and supported by Richard Donaldson. These members did a great job keeping on top of maintenance and were integral in IRB education throughout the season.

James Purvis's assistance as Vice-Captain was instrumental in keeping the lifesaving section running smoothly. James had supported our previous Club Captain Rebecca Chapman and continues to do so supporting myself in this critical role. I cannot thank him enough for his efforts over the last 4 seasons that he



has been in this role, and I look forward to working with him in the future. He is always ready to pitch in and help out wherever needed and was instrumental in supporting and facilitating the annual awards night.

North Steyne SLSC has an incredibly diverse membership whose skills and knowledge are evident every patrol. Your commitment to public safety is unparalleled, and your influence to teach the next generation the requisite skills, and pass on the knowledge to ensure we continue to provide our community service is exceptional. I look forward to seeing each of you continue surf life



saving's proud tradition of vigilance and service at our community Club.

Marketing Director's Report - David Cowell



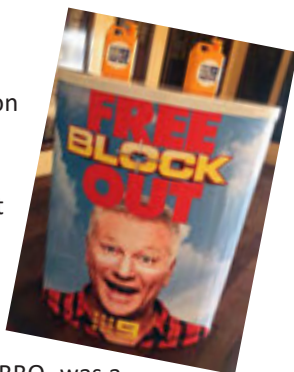
The backdrop of North Steyne SLSC's 110th anniversary year was perfect to showcase all that is Black & Gold, the fabulous history of 111 seasons on our beach, the breadth and diversity across our membership. This season has been shared with our sponsors, supporters, donors as well as the broader lifesaving movement and our local community. North Steyne SLSC was splashed across all forms

of media from Surf Lifesaving newsletters to newspapers, social media and mainstream TV.

Sponsors

Our generous sponsors were again on board for our 110th Anniversary Season and as always, a huge thanks for their generous support.

Channel 9 News were again prominent on the beach with their banners and surfboat sponsorship whilst also undertaking a number of beach activations to provide water stations at events and TV show promotions. A Nipper Parent 'reliever' - a day on the BBQ, was a most welcome variation on sponsor support and indicates their involvement with our Club at all levels. We were also fortunate during the *Family Food Fight* promotion to be the winner of monies being offered. North Steyne fought it out against other Sydney Clubs that Channel 9 sponsor.



Candice Cattell and team Stone Real Estate, our Manly agent, were again on board and a big part of the early season events including the 110th Anniversary Dinner at St Patrick's Estate. Candice has been a sponsor now for several years and we trust this continues.

Manly Surf School hold a prominent position in our Club building on the sand. They have been generous in their support with us at North Steyne Beach and continue to offer support of our fundraising activities.

The Hotel Steyne returned to our Club and have been a new sponsor of the Surf Boat teams. They have also been fundraising with our competition teams to assist with equipment and the cost of getting to competitions. They will continue to be a part of



North Steyne SLSC for the foreseeable future and happy to host any event you may have.

Finally, as we go to print the ink has now dried on a new sponsor for next season. Chris Perry and the team at Pure Legal have come on board and will be a huge part of the Surf Boat section. This is a huge injection for the Surf Boat Crews and we will see this roll out from the start of the next season.

Thanks again to all sponsors for your generous support and as Club members we should all be patronising their services whenever the opportunity arises.

Building Grants

The Community Building Partnership Grant received in 2014 for building upgrades was finally expended and \$49,500 was received at the end of September. This grant allowed many areas of the building to be upgraded or improved with works including: installation of a new shade sail over the outdoor courtyard; rubber flooring for the Nipper's and main board cages; a new ventilated fuel cabinet in the IRB shed; new stairs to the beach, the IRB shed and club entries; slip treatment to the change rooms, training board area and the main front steps; stripping and sealing of the southern boatshed floor; safety signage; and, new board racking is underway for the main board cage.

The NSW Government Office of Sport grant awarded in March 2017 for a total \$175,000 (\$130,000 from the NSW Government, and \$45,000 which is to be provided in kind, cash, donations or other support) is being negotiated with Council. Whilst primarily for the replacement of the balconies, this grant will also be used to improve access to the Club and replace the roller shutters at the northern end of the building.

In August 2017, the Club applied for and was successful in attaining a building grant from the Northern Beaches Council.



These funds are part of the council amalgamation program with \$1m being available to the Northern Beaches surf lifesaving clubs. We still await details of the \$200,000 grant which is to provide new complying stairs to the Club from the promenade, as well as an accessibility ramp to the public hall.

In 2018, the Club was successful in attaining two additional grants of just over \$56,000 to replace the gas boosted solar hot water system, and upgrade and improve the clothing room storage, kitchen in the hall, patrol room and club room. These works will be designed for approval during the off-season with works to commence over the next few months.

Program and Special Project Grants and Donations

Several other grants were awarded towards Club programs, initiatives and special projects.

A grant was received from the NSW Government Office of Sport for just over \$24,000 towards the Ripper Nippers Access to Sport, the North Steyne beach carnival, training for coaches and the club room and bar area. Two of these grants have already been acquitted with events held this season, and the other works to commence shortly.

Other grants and donations included:

Clubs Grants NSW, Balgowlah RSL, \$6,000;

JN Kirby Foundation, \$5,960, for the Ripper Nippers and Nippers programs;

Lendlease Foundation, \$2,200, for the Ripper Nippers and Nippers programs;

DormaKaba, \$2,750, for rescue boards;

Warnanbool SLSC for the donation of a Nipper's board;

Manly Lions Club, \$4,000, for Ripper Nippers;

Channel 9, \$5,000, for the Family Food Fight promotion;

Balgowlah RSL, \$5,000, North Steyne Ocean Swim;

Sydney Northern Beaches Branch Surf Lifesaving Equipment grant.

Fundraising

Finally, the Club conducted several fundraising activities which the membership actively participated in. The first was a 110th Anniversary Wine Fundraiser organised in conjunction with Mark Maddox and Kayinga Vineyards Limited in South Australia. This was a great success and raised just over \$4,200, as well as provided many gifts and prizes for special events.

The 2018 Sun Run involved almost 80 volunteers, and we raised \$3,000 from the event. Finally, the 110th Black & Gold Raffle raised \$2,700 with prizes donated from many Club supporters including Artussi by Eurolinx for the main raffle prize, Balgowlah RSL, Bennett Surfboards, Brookvale Bike Factory, Diageo, Dripping Wet, Hotel Steyne, Manly Surf School, Three Beans Café Manly and Zoggs.

All in all, it was an exceptional effort and the much needed funds will be used for our programs and activities for many seasons to come.

Youth Director's Report - Jo Cooper



2017-18 was another strong season for our 14-17 year-olds, patrolling, training and doing further awards at North Steyne and all with smiles on their faces.

Following on from the successful program for youth members over the previous seasons, an achievement this year within our youth membership was the completion of the "Steyne.d Challenge" by a dedicated cohort for a second year.

The Steyne.d Challenge

Held during the month of January the Steyne.d Challenge is a 28-day event which has been developed for the Club's youth to have fun, improve membership retention, strengthen engagement and improve lifesaving skills. Importantly, it provides an opportunity for our younger members coming out of the structured format of Nippers to have a way to get into activities in the senior club and enjoy time with other youth members at North Steyne.



The Challenge encompasses a broad range of activities, and everyone who participates makes a commitment to complete a daily challenge from the range of activities over a 28-day period. The Challenge has an image and a brand and to highlight achievement participants become 'Steyne.d Survivors' at the completion of the Challenge – having met set criteria during the challenge.

Executing the Challenge requires collaboration. The youth portfolio directs the program, with significant involvement from the Board, club coaches, patrol captains, parents and supporters along with the fantastic young people of our Club.



Results

The Steyne.d Challenge engages a group of youth members who do something every day for 28 days. The resulting 1000+ hours of additional volunteering and training over their regular patrol hours are a great testament to the success of the event.

Our youth members undertook numerous courses over the season including:

SRC; Bronze; First Aid; ARTC; IRBC; IRBD and Training Officer.

Youth Networking and Mental Health First Aid

This season North Steyne Cadets were part of a great initiative supported by Surf Lifesaving Sydney Northern Beaches Branch. An inter-club collaboration between Narrabeen, North Steyne and Avalon SLSCs saw the hosting of three Youth Networking and Mental Health First Aid days where our younger members came together from across the branch to get to know each other, learn about watching out for one another, and better understanding what to do if someone needs help. The days were a great success thanks to the great crew of facilitators, Batyr, Johnny Shannon and Burn Bright who provided some brilliant ways to open the channels of communication on difficult topics and in a fun environment. Enormous thanks to Branch, Tracey Hare-Boyd in particular, Tammy Cook from Narrabeen and Mike Stanley Jones at Avalon for their hard work in making the events such wonderful days for our group. Such initiatives can only make the lifesaving movement more resilient and our beaches a better place to be.

Wet 'N' Wild

We had almost 200 Nippers on the beach in November for the third annual visit of Sydney's Wet 'N' Wild Nippers. 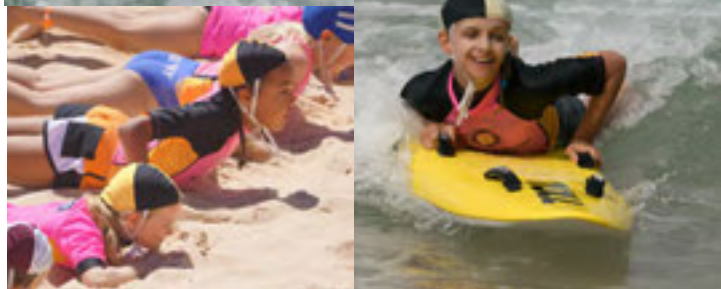
Sunday Nippers simply would not happen without our enthusiastic and committed team of Age Managers, parents and the Nippers management team that never failed to get the job done.

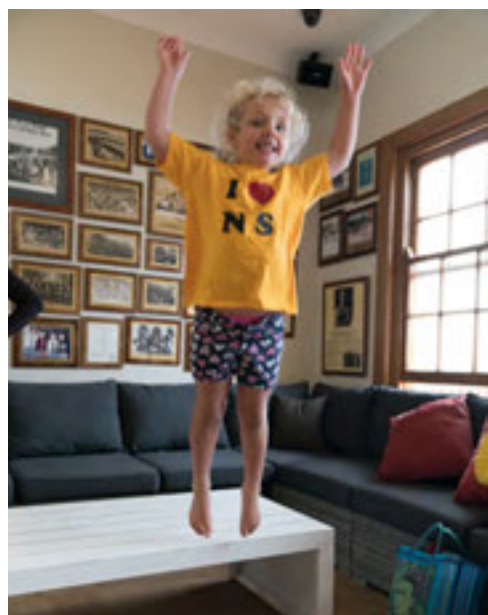
I would like to thank all the patrols. Sometimes we had so many volunteers that it was almost dangerous! The next week, however, there were so

All in all we had a great season and finished with our record intact of no lives lost in 110 years whilst we have been on patrol. Our members are to thank for our terrific celebrations as North Steyne members not exist without our members who volunteer their time to ensure the community is safe on our beach. The generations who have come before us would be very proud of what North Steyne has become, and we will continue to ensure an even stronger Club into the future.





20th Annual Ocean Swim -

North Steyne's ocean swim is regarded as one of the best swims in the calendar. In our 20th year, we lived up to these expectations and more.

In the week leading up to the swim, the swell gods had sent a flurry of huge surf for the organisers to sweat on with hazardous surf warnings, rainy and cold days. The organisers did daily surf report checks and watched the weather forecast. Whilst the weather was looking good for the day, the swell was still forecast to remain big. Ironically, the logo and picture on the sought after ocean swim t-shirt was changed to incorporate a wave....who would have known!!

On the Sunday morning, 25 April 2018, as final set-up was taking place, the waves were hard to predict with small sets coming in, but then larger ones would strike. At one stage, it looked like the 1km swim would take a right hand turn towards Shelly but at the last minute, organisers decided to leave the course as it was and ran the 1km swim towards Queenscliff and back.

With buoys and markers being ushered out to sea and the course taking shape, the beach too was starting to come alive. Club President Frank Traugott and David Cowell with their set-up crew started raising the roofs on the pop-up tents. The finish funnel was put in place and sponsor's and supporter's flags were raised and banners hung to add some colour to the event.

The course was again perfectly laid out by our team of reliable IRB drivers headed by Richard Donaldson. Distinguished member Shannon Job worked alongside Club Captain Dan Hillier taking on the responsibility for water safety coordination on the beach.

In the hall, registration personnel were arriving along with our treasury. Our greeter was on hand to ensure the crowd flowed to the correct sections and no one was left looking lost at the door.

Our hardworking team of registration takers and treasury settled in to make sure that all swimmers were entered, marked off, capped, tagged and ready for the starting line.

The number of swimmers this year surprised the organisers as year after year most swimmers wait to see what the conditions and weather are like on the morning of the swim. However, this year, despite the weather and swell forecast, online registrations were at an all-time high. Just as many registrations were also taken on the day, and in the end 434 swimmers were officially registered, with 378 swimmers completing the swim due to the swell and possibly some other factors.

It was also surprising that the majority of swimmers chose to participate in the 2.8km swim in the challenging conditions, as in previous years, the majority of swimmers had signed up to do the short course.

By the time the first wave of swimmers was on the line for the 1km swim, the sun was making the day enjoyable, however, the swell was still menacing, making a few people anxious about the conditions.

As in previous years, the 1km course took off from North Steyne and headed north towards Queenscliff and then back. The 2.8km swim headed south to Cabbage Tree Bay turning towards Manly and then heading north back to the shores of North Steyne. Due to the conditions and swell, some competitors chose to start the race further north on the beach to take advantage of a rip that was running half way down towards Queenscliff.

With the swell rising and falling and the tide coming and going, it was difficult not only for the competitors, but for our water safety who used rescue tubes, rescue boards, and were in the IRB. They are to be congratulated and thanked as the conditions were extremely challenging and the whole team of volunteers were exceptional in managing these.

Of special mention is George van Dyck who assisted with water safety on Support Ski 3. George spent the morning on the ski in the break zone assisting, herding, leading and rescuing swimmers as necessary.

North Steyne's reputation for running a well organised and safe ocean swim continues to build year after year. As well, the event would not be possible without the amazing volunteers who put their hands up to help out with water and beach set-up, registrations, fruit cutting and distribution, data entry, water safety, first aid, pack down and clean-up of everything.

As the volunteers started packing up there were no complaints, just thanks from the swimmers who had attended and enjoyed themselves. The word on the beach and feedback received was that the 20th ocean swim was definitely challenging, but very worthwhile to compete in.

Congratulations to all of those involved and to all who helped make this ocean swim another great success. A special thanks goes to the A-Team who ran a wonderful and delicious BBQ. Thanks to our major sponsor, Balgowlah RSL for their continued support of the ocean swim, and also thanks to the Directors of Balgowlah RSL for their continued support of North Steyne.

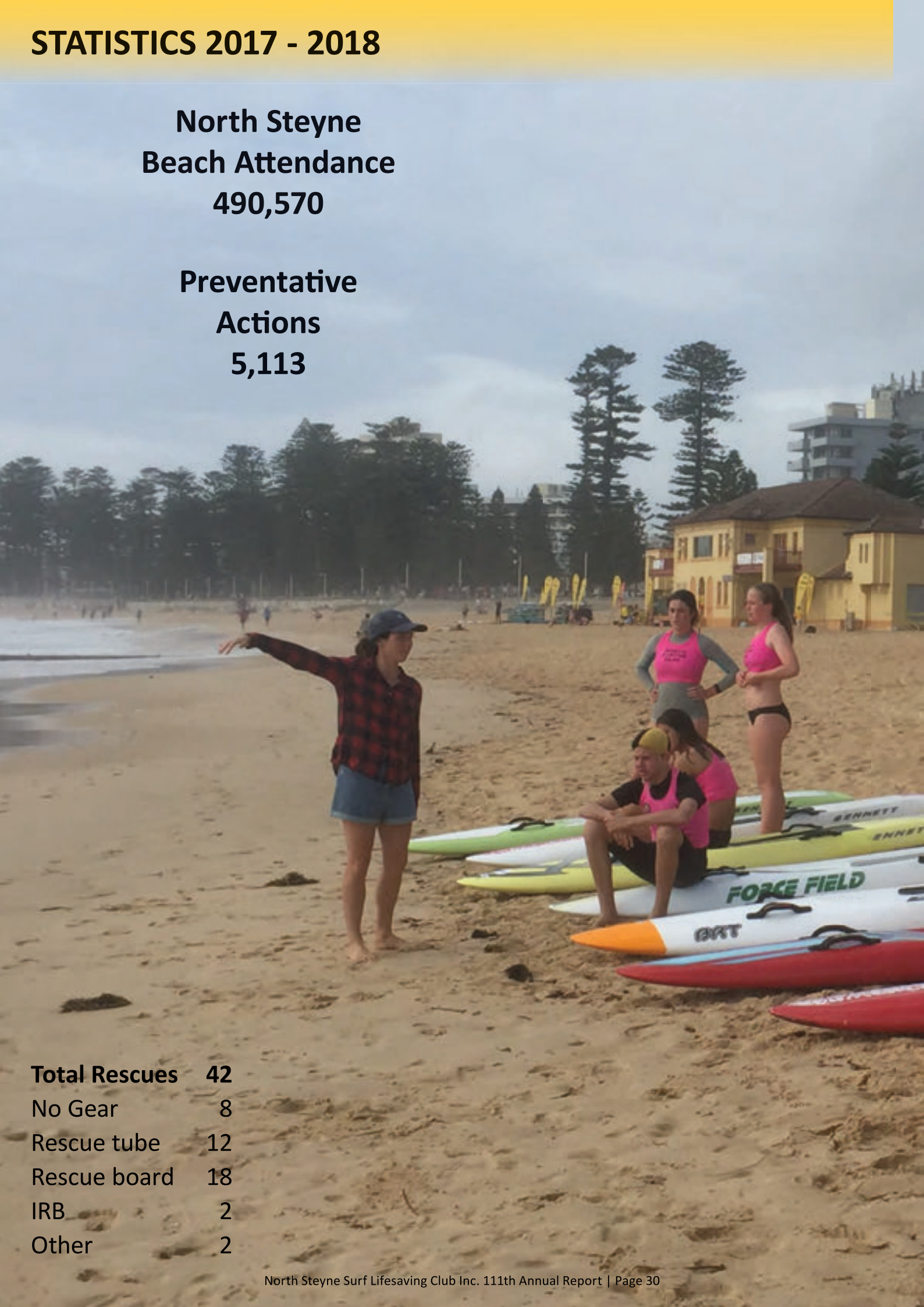

Competition Director's Report - Jodie Frazer

Lifesaving

Our Champion Lifesaver competitors had another successful season with Joe Jenkins securing his 2nd Bronze Aussie's medal in this event in Perth. North Steyne also achieved Branch and State medal placings in the male U17 event (Joe Jenkins and Ewan Cooper-Frater) and female Masters (Deb Foote). 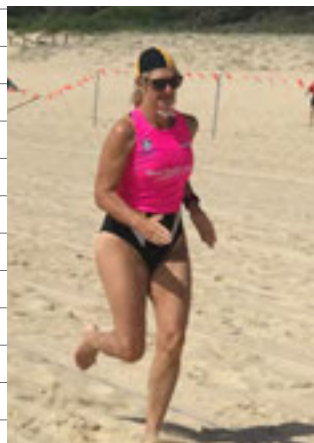

Treasurer's Report - Tony Falzarano



I have great pleasure in presenting the 2018 Financial Report for the North Steyne Surf Life Saving Club.

Most areas of revenue improved on the level of the previous season, with total revenue increasing from \$291,679 to \$365,889. There were two major contributors to this increase. The first being the receipt of the \$45,000 grant from the NSW

Government's Community Building Partnership Program (CBPP Grant). The other being an increase in fundraising activities of \$27,241 (mainly due to the 110 year anniversary dinner and the associated wine fundraiser). Total expenditure increased from \$258,815 to \$326,643. There were four major contributors to the increase. They were the expenditure of the CBPP grant, the costs of the 110 year anniversary dinner and wine fundraiser, and an increase in competition costs.

The strong financial results enabled the Board to approve total allocations to the Building Fund of \$15,663 and \$8,263 to the Future Fund. The net profit after the Special Purpose Fund allocations was \$39,246 (\$32,864 last season).

Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 31 May 2018

Note 1 - Summary of significant accounting policies

The following explains the significant accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the financial statements. Unless otherwise stated, such accounting policies were also adopted in the corresponding reporting period.

General

The financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial report preparation requirements of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission and Charitable Fundraising Act. The board has determined that the club is not a reporting entity. North Steyne Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a not-for-profit entity for the purpose of preparing the financial statements.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 and the following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report.

Basis of accounting

The statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values, or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

Registration fees

All registration fees are brought to account in the year to which they apply as and when received from the members. The capitation fees, due to Surf Life Saving New South Wales Inc and Sydney Northern Beaches Surf Life Saving, are remitted as and when invoiced and shown as a separate expenditure item.

Marketing and sponsorship income

Marketing & sponsorship income is recognised when amounts are received or receivable.

Cash at bank

Cash at bank and term deposits represents monies deposited with the Commonwealth Bank of Australia and Bank of Queensland.

Comparative figure

When required by the accounting standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year. No attempt has been made to reclassify or reanalyse prior years' expenses.

Inventories

Inventories have been valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Property, plant and equipment

- i. Property, plant and equipment are carried at cost, independent of directors' valuations. All assets are depreciated over their useful life
- ii. Over the years, the club has collected considerable memorabilia. In the past this memorabilia has been recorded at a nominal value and subsequently fully depreciated to zero hence the financial accounts do not ascribe any value to memorabilia assets
- iii. The cost of the day to day servicing of property, plant and equipment is recognised in the profit and loss as incurred
- iv. Net depreciation and amortisation rates used for each major class of asset are:

Note 2 – Related parties

Transactions with committee members or their committee-member related entity occurred within a normal member or supplier relationship on terms and conditions no more favourable than those which it is reasonable to expect that the entity would have adopted if dealing with the committee member or their committee-member at arms-length in the same circumstance.

Note 3 – Segment information

The club derives revenue primarily from its members, sponsors and fundraising activities to support its role in providing beach life saving services and operations. The club's activities are principally carried out at North Steyne Beach, located in NSW.

Note 4 – Subsequent events

There has not been any matter or circumstance that has arisen since the end of the financial year that has significantly affected, or may significantly affect, the operations of the club, the results of those operations or the state of affairs of the club in the next financial year. Similar to last year, during this financial year the amalgamation of the former Manly Council with the former Warringah and Pittwater Councils to form a new Northern Beaches Council further progressed. We have been informed that Northern Beaches Council funding to North Steyne for the next season, under our patrol agreement, will be on similar terms and levels as for this past season.

Note 5 – NSW Government grant for club facilities upgrades

The club received an amount of \$45,000 during the year from the 2014 NSW Government Community Building Partnership Program.

The club is yet to receive its \$130,000 for the balcony replacement, repairs for safety, security and maintenance through the 2017 NSW Government's Surf Club Facility Development Program. This project is being managed by the Northern Beaches Council and they have engaged an engineer to prepare engineering plans for the balcony replacement works. Northern Beaches Council and North Steyne are currently reviewing quotations received from interested builders through an open process from 11 April until 3 May 2018.

Independent Auditor's Report

To the Members of North Steyne Surf Life Saving Club Inc.

Opinion

I have audited the financial report of North Steyne Surf Life Saving Club Inc., ("the Club"), which comprises the statement of financial position as at 31 May 2018, the statement of comprehensive income and the statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies, and the statement of members of the committee.

My conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of my auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Club to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial report, including the disclosures, and whether the financial report represents the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.


