It is with sadness that we report the passing of Joe Jenkins, Sadie Ryan, Doug Webb, Dr John Killick and Geoff Deegan. Our sincere sympathies to their families and our members who have suffered the loss of loved ones this past season.



JOSEPH "JOE" JENKINS

Joe tragically passed away in New Zealand in August 2021 at the age of 20. Joe joined North Steyne SLSC as a Nipper in 2010. He won bronze in champion lifesaver at three successive "Aussies" and several state gold medals in champion lifesaver and bronze as a member of the open patrol competition team.

Whilst Joe will be remembered as an outstanding athlete he will also be remembered for his service to the community and humility. He was a member of Patrol 9 for 8 seasons. After obtaining his bronze medallion he did a total 256 patrol hours, more than 35 hours per season and received his 5 year SLSC national patrol service award.

The family held a livestream Requiem mass and the club held a paddle out to honour Joe. A special board was made by Bennett and a special award established at the Presentation Night in the name of Joe. The club received many letters of condolences from other surf clubs.

The following words from Warnambool SLSC were particularly poignant and reflected the sentiment.

Losing members is always a moment that needs to be recognised in the Surf Lifesaving community but in the instance of the passing of your young member in Joseph Jenkins, the grief is felt across the country and especially with those that have shared the friendships and the embrace of your Club. As a club that has been in existence for over 90 years the Warnambool Surf Life Saving Club understands the power that exists within its community, and we hope that the opportunity to draw on this collective strength is possible for all of you ...

Fly high mate! You left a lasting impression on many and will not be forgotten.

SARAH "SADIE" RYAN

Sadie was the club's first female recipient of a Distinguished Service Award. Her tireless work with the lady's auxillary spanned three decades in the late 1900's. She was a great, and vocal supporter of the North Steyne rugby teams. As the matriarch of the Ryan Clan, she encouraged her sons, Chas and Jack in their membership of the club, where they completed their patrols and competed in carnivals. Her daughter, Linda ably assisted her with the social aspect of North Steyne.

DOUG WEBB

Doug was a member in the 1970's and 80's. He was the son of Life Member, George Webb and brother of Graham. Doug was an active patrol member and a highly accomplished North Steyne rugby player. He moved from The Peninsula to Bathurst, where he raised a family. George Webb became the fourth of only six North Steyne members to become a Life Member (No.34) of SLSC. The coveted Patrol of the Year award is named in honour of George Webb.

DR JOHN KILLICK

The club has only just learnt of the passing of Dr John Killick on Monday 31st August 2020 at the age of 88. He is the father of Alistair and Eve who were both active members of the club. The club benefitted enormously from John's skill and profession as a doctor. He was Chief Instructor for four years from 1978 to 1981 and again in 1986 during the presidency of Arthur McCarroll. John had one experience as a boat sweep. On the way back in the boat rolled with the crew and oars being flung out of the boat. Nick Roelvink said "Doc, You're good at a lot of things, but that is the last time you take a boat out." John is also the father of Eve Killick who was in the first women's bronze group for the club in 1981, when her Father was the instructor. Eve has returned and completed her bronze medallion award again this season.

GEOFF DEEGAN

Geoff passed away on Tuesday 21st June 2022 after a long illness. He was a member from 1959 to early 1970's and a long service member after that. Geoff was often helping out at carnivals.

President's Foreward

It has been a roller coaster of a season with many ups and downs, highs and lows, happiness and sorrow. We started in lockdown not knowing when and if the season would commence. Later in the season, Mother Nature was not kind to us and our patrolling, usual activities and the NSW State Championships were significantly disrupted by the wild weather.

Despite this, we worked hard to ensure things could go on as planned. Our members demonstrated determination, courage and most of all resilience. We pulled together, showed up on the beach, adapted to the conditions and continued in our tradition of keeping people safe on North Steyne Beach.

In our 115th season, we can proudly say that once again no lives were lost on North Steyne Beach whilst on patrol. This is because of our exceptional life savers, our outstanding trainers and the resilience of our members.

Our member numbers held steady with a total membership count of 828, which represents a 99.9% return rate. This figure was above average for our Branch and thank you to all our members who returned to the Club or chose North Steyne to obtain your Bronze Medallion.

On Sunday, 8th August 2021, we held our Annual General Meeting online. A very experienced team returned to the Board, along with some new people who have added great ideas and energy throughout the season. A special mention goes to Jack Sutherland who is our Deputy President and with his 68 years of membership also brings his very wise views. I appreciate all the support he provides to me. I would also like to acknowledge Tony Falzarano who stepped off the Board after serving as Treasurer for many years and did an outstanding job.



We embarked on a strategic plan and looked to where we want to be in 2025. The Board is focused on four areas to ensure we are sustainable into the future. These areas are:

1. Membership – to engage and grow our membership base;
2. Clubhouse – secure tenure and commence our building refurbishment;
3. Business – improve how we run things and leverage the NSW State Championships;
4. Leadership – develop our people and involve our local community.

We are working on specific activities related to these goals and are progressing on our strategic vision.

At the end of October, we participated in the Gotch4Life 24Hour Row to raise money for mental health awareness. Members young and old participated and we raised just shy of \$8000 for this very worthy cause. Thanks to Ally Stirling for her great efforts in coordinating this event.

When we could finally get together face-to-face, we held a Special General Meeting on Saturday, 11th December 2021 which recognised the contribution of many of our members. Congratulations to Richard Donaldson for receiving life membership – what a deserving recognition for an outstanding contributor to our Club.

We hosted our North Steyne Boat Carnival in January. We had some 70 crews compete in what was an action-packed day, including our own five crews. I would like to acknowledge and thank NED Australian Whisky for their great support of our boats. All our competitors did us proud during the season, including all our Nippers who had some impressive results during carnivals. We had a strong Nipper contingent on the beach, and as always, it was great to see the Ripper Nippers each Sunday. What a fantastic group of kids and every year I am amazed at what they achieve. Thank you, David Cowell, for doing such an awesome job with these wonderful kids.

Our big focus during the season was the preparation for the NSW State Championships, hosted by Queenscliff, and scheduled to be held at North Steyne. The Age Championships kicked off as planned in mid-February, but due to health concerns and adverse weather conditions, these were cancelled after a few days. With continued extreme weather and the significant erosion of the beach, the very difficult decision was made by Surf Life Saving NSW to cancel the whole event.



While this was a disappointment, it was the right decision to ensure the health and safety of all competitors. We look forward to assisting with the NSW State Championships again in 2023.

With the adverse weather, our Emergency Call Out Team was in full swing and special thanks to David Guthrie, Jack Watt and a small team of our dedicated volunteers who participated in the flood rescue efforts. We had people dispatched to places such as Nowra and Penrith and worked in partnership with the SES to help where needed.

We had the pleasure of naming and dedicating a new IRB to the late Neil Purcell OAM, a life member and at North Steyne for over 70 years. While he passed away a few years ago, it was great to remember him and reflect on his dedication and great contribution to our Club.

We were well represented at the Australian Championships which were held on the Gold Coast. A big congratulations to Shannon Job who came home with the GOLD in the male Champion Lifesaver (30-39yrs) and Sarah Lally who won BRONZE in the female Champion Lifesaver (30-39yrs). We had a great team representing North Steyne and well done to all involved!

Our end-of-season awards night in May wrapped up the year. The mighty Patrol 5 won the coveted Patrol of the Year for all their outstanding efforts over the season. Our Club Person of the year was Shannon Job who was recognised for taking on the role as treasurer, managing our participation in the NSW State Championships, winning a gold at Aussies and just being a fantastic ambassador for and contributor to North Steyne.

Other outstanding award winners included: Young Club Person of the Year, Lachlan Van der Pluijm; President's Award, Jack Watt; Patrol person of the Year, Mark Stewart; Captain's Trophy, David Guthrie; and Volunteer of the Year, Claire Oxlade. We were also honoured to have presented for the first time the Joseph "Joe" Jenkins Memorial Award. This special award went to Oscar Cowell whose attitude and actions reflect everything that Joe stood for. Oscar is a fitting winner in remembrance of an outstanding young man.



In the wider community, we assisted with the Northern Beaches Sun Run, and we provided water safety crews for the Cerebral Palsy 20 Twenty Fundraising event. We also worked with Surfing NSW on the Sydney Surf Pro in May and helped with the running of two bars during the competition. Big thanks to Paul Mathew for all his great work and to others for assisting with running the bar for this event.

A highlight was welcoming a group of students from Dubbo, as part of the Clontarf Foundation's reward programme. We ran some SLS training activities for the boys and had fun in the surf with help from our Cadets as Water Safety.



This is my third year as President and I am proud to be leading a Club with a strong tradition of serving the community and one that is made up of such a great group of people.

To our key sponsors the Balgowlah RSL, Manly Lions, and NED Australian Whisky, our Patrons James Griffin, David Hay and Jean Hay AM, and Des McAteer, our members, and to all my fellow North Steyne Directors, thank you for your great support and outstanding contribution. Our Club was greatly impacted by the WWI, only seven years after our establishment. Then came WWII which called many members to battle once again and saw barbed wire on our beach with the fear of a Japanese invasion. The Korean War and the Vietnam War came next. A substantial number of our members were sent to these conflicts, some receiving great accolades and some never returning. During all that adversity, we could count how many members we lost, and how many we had at home to patrol our beach.



When COVID-19 hit in 2020, Dan Hiller was Club Captain with Jack Watt was Club Vice Captain, they both faced uncertainty, not knowing if we could fulfil our patrolling obligations. The past couple of seasons have been another level of challenge that will certainly go down in history.

Jack stepped up as Club Captain for this season and we still had no idea how many people they had to patrol our beach. We were unsure of what was expected, how we were to operate, and there was again a high-level of uncertainty. As always though, our members rallied and came to the fore and made it possible for our Club Captain to put patrols on our beach every week and ensure the safety of our community.

I am very please to say that no lives were lost once again for this season, our 115th year.

On top of the pandemic, this was perhaps our worst summer ever with the wild weather, pollution and the destruction of our beach. We were able to run several large events, and others were all organised and ready to go, only to be cancelled. The way Jack, with the support of Kyra, this season managed things and how our members stepped up, we should be very proud that we kept things going in the true tradition of our Club. Thanks for their excellent work and thanks to all our great members.

This season, one event I was pleased to be involved in was the IRB Naming Ceremony. It was an honour to present the newest inflatable rescue boat to our fleet, named in honour of our friend and fellow "Clubbie" Neil Purcell, OAM and Life Member. Thank you to the crowd that showed on the day to support the unveiling and to join in the celebrations.

I am very pleased to say that our Life Member Coffee Mornings are back!! First Wednesdays of every month we get together in the Clubroom for a chat and a cuppa. All welcome!

Finally, I would like to thank my fellow Directors for all your hard work, organising everything and keeping things going during this unusual season; and extra special thanks to Claire for all her support on the BBQ, our A team are always super organised with her help.

Secretary's Report

North Steyne had big plans for the season. Instead, for events beyond its control the season could easily be referred to as the "stop, start, stop again, start again season". It was odd for many reasons. It was challenging, frustrating, distressing and hard. But it was also exceptional and inspirational. Despite the frustrations members should feel pleased with what the club attempted to achieve and what it did achieve. The club did many things on a scale it had never done before.

There were many unusual practices and events. On 8th August 2021 the club held its AGM by zoom for the first time in its history. The agenda was restricted to business only including the election of board directors and panels. Then, on 11th August, there was a personal tragedy that rocked the entire club - the tragic death of Joe Jenkins at the age of 20. This was devastating. It was dignified the way the North Steyne "family" and the Jenkins family rallied to support one another and honour the memory of Joe.

The season had many other setbacks. The season start was delayed by another COVID-19 lockdown and restrictions. It began with "stay at home" orders. Then outdoor exercise was permitted in groups of two within your local government area. That rule caused great confusion, angst and a lot of administration.

There were many uncertainties. When would the season start? What would it look like? Would we have members? What age will those members be? The NSW Government and health authorities, as an incentive to allow people to come out of lockdown, mandated vaccination. Policies on vaccination were complex and changed frequently. Early on only members who were 16+ and double vaccinated were allowed to participate. If that was not hard enough the club was expected to police strict compliance. The club was expected to check vaccination status and record it in surfguard. Access to the club was closed. There was no hall hire. It was a stressful and challenging time. It led to a significant amount of disharmony, increase in administration and had to be managed. Special thanks to Cath, Chris, Paul, Jack and Dan for steering us through this.

In early September gear inspection was undertaken by clubs in lockdown. That has never been done before but we got through. Flags were raised on 18th September with strict rules applying to patrols and beachgoers. Patrols were restricted to six members. Masks were required to be worn.

As NSW vaccination rates increased, things started to open up and rules changed again. Nippers and Surf sports had to develop contingency plans for

staggered starts. Nippers started on 7th November and North Steyne hosted the first carnival in the branch on Sunday 14th November. It was a successful carnival but attendance was down due to COVID-19 concerns. Well done Sarah, Surf sports and Nippers.



So now the club is beginning to function towards normal. Considerable efforts were made to retain and encourage new members. Towards the end of October NSW vaccination rates had reached 80%. We were beginning to be more confident we would have some members and a clubhouse that could be readily accessed. The club reopened on 11th October. Our BBQ and Club bar re-started a few weeks after.

Our membership was impressive considering the start. Membership remained steady at 828, a return rate of 99.9%, in line with branch membership.

On 11th December we held a Special General Meeting (SGM) in the club. It was the first SGM the club has conducted in more than a decade. At that meeting Richard Donaldson was elected to Life Membership, Tony Falzarano given Distinguished Service and Brian Mariotti given Outstanding Service for their longstanding service to the club. Congratulations and well deserved.

In late December, SLSNSW circulated a COVID-19 Vaccination Policy mandating vaccines for everyone 13years+ participating in surf lifesaving and coming into effect on 1 February 2022.

Discussions and planning to support Queenscliff SLSC with hosting the NSW State Championships had begun in August. It was a big event and undertaking.

In November, I attended the SLSNSW media launch at Queenscliff with the other stakeholders. On 14th December the club signed a historic 3-year agreement with SLSNSW to support

Queenscliff SLSC as a host club and run events on North Steyne beach. Thank you Shannon Job who took on the role as Club Liaison Officer and Chris Stewart for your negotiations with SLSNSW, Queenscliff SLSC and Northern Beaches Council.

A lot of work had gone into preparing for the State Championships. The Northern Beaches Council organised and completed the painting works inside the Hall and Clubroom before the event. Thanks to our members for removing memorabilia, and David Cowell, Paul Mathew, Claire Oxlade, Liv Pennie and others for refit of the bar. These efforts transformed the club.



The NSW State Championships was scheduled from 24th Feb - 13th March. We were ready and keen to welcome competitors from the rest of the state. Our hall was utilised as the administration and media centre for SLSNSW. In the lead up to and including the Nippers championships an extreme La Nina weather event occurred along eastern Australia causing havoc weather. Sydney Northern Beaches was not spared. Beaches were eroded, coastal waters were polluted. This led to the cancellation of the remainder of the championships after only a few days. This unprecedented weather event continued until July with a brief respite in May and June. Along with the pandemic, the weather event defined our season. Our Ocean Swim was cancelled and the Cerebral Palsy event we support was postponed. It even rained during the Sun Run and the Sydney SurfPro.

The Sydney Surf Pro returned to our beach, attracting some of the world's top surfers. Running from 14th - 24th May, we signed an agreement to support the event. The clubhouse was utilised as their administration and media centre, a unique opportunity for the club. We obtained a

The focus was on service to the community from our lifesavers who went to war, some making the ultimate sacrifice.

Club administration was also busy in other areas – drafting Treasury and Administration policies, agreements with SLSNSW and Surfing NSW, progress towards a new lease, charities commission filings, COVID-19 policies, compliance with regulations and general administration to run the club. Board meetings were generally well attended by zoom, in the room or both.

Thanks to George Van Dyck (in first half of the season) and Shannon Job for managing our finances in Treasury. A big thanks to Cath Hillier in the role of Administration Manager, to keep the club running smoothly and for compiling the Annual Report. Education Director's Report

What a year! Another one impacted by COVID-19 lockdowns, releases and unprecedented weather events. The good news we did get a patrolling season and with that training across the club.

My first year as Chief Training Officer, with David Guthrie as Assistant, presented us with a number of new opportunities including building on the number of trainers we have and looking at more diverse and unique training opportunities for members outside the norm, for example the ALBERT course. Overall, the training this year was broader.

Annual Proficiencies

The start of the year saw the education team work with lifesaving to ensure our members were competent with annual proficiencies across all relevant awards.

Surf Rescue Certificates (SRC)

The SRC is the first award heading into surf lifesaving undertaken by U14 members. The SRC involves teaching our young members the skills they will need to become a lifesaver and to help prepare them to take the next step the Bronze Medallion. I would like to thank Jodie Frazer and her team of helpers who were instrumental in getting our Youth members ready and trained to take the SRC course. Congratulations to Jodie on winning the Gary O'Sullivan Trophy for Trainer of the Year.

Bronze Medallion

The Bronze is a critical award to ensure we have lifesavers to patrol the beach. It is open to anyone over 15 years of age. This year we had a mixed group consisting of matriculating SRC's, Nipper parents, friends of patrolling members and school groups. We also had a returning member, Eve Killick. This is a shout out to Eve. Eve was in the first female bronze group to go through North Steyne in the 1980's, pictured below, with her Dad as CTO. Her time away from the club meant she

needed to re-sit the bronze and she did so in challenging conditions at Whale and Palm Beach. Well done and welcome back Eve! You are a true asset to North Steyne!

IRB Awards

The inflatable rescue boat or IRB is a critical operational tool that is used in modern surf lifesaving. It allows quick access to water based rescues or support in almost any situation. IRB Crew and Drivers are critical members of surf patrols and their education ensures we have competent and operational ready members to help the public in the surf or increasingly as part of emergency service requirements such as flood rescues.

This year we would like to thank four of our members who stepped up to become Drivers under the guidance of our very experienced trainers Richard Donaldson, Dave Guthrie and Kyra Jenkins. Congratulations to Brian Mariotti, Ewan Cooper-Frater, Sarah Lally and Matthew Riordan.

First Aid

Understanding First Aid is one of the core functions necessary for our members on patrol.

In 2021, a new updated version of the course, the HLTAID011 Provide First Aid replaced the superseded course so it was necessary to encourage our members to upgrade, even those who only just completed the course the year before. Thank you to those of you who managed to do this either online, external or in person at the club. It is great to see you are all keen to keep your skills and awards up to date.

This course upgrade in turn affected our ability to run an Advanced Resuscitation Technique (ART) Course. Only members who upgraded their



First Aid could sit the new ART course. SLSSNB assisted here by running the course at branch hq, but next season we hope to be able to run the ART course from our Club.

Beach Management

This award trains members on how to manage the beach and patrol as a Patrol Captain. We have been fortunate to see growing interest in these senior and important roles which is good news for the club. Congratulations to Hanna Clare, Freya O'Neill and Shane O'Neill for gaining their BM's.

Officials Course

This year we ran an Officials course at North Steyne. We saw a number of members including Nipper Parents and Boaties complete the course to ensure we had representation at Carnivals we were participating in.

RWC Pilots (Jetski)

This season it was good to see we had a number of members participate in the Rescue Water Craft (RWC) Jet ski program run through Branch.

Overall, there have been some excellent training opportunities taken up by our members. We have also had some challenges this season given that some of the knowledge base was lost with trainers either moving to other clubs or to adventures outside surf.

We have been fortunate to have available more advanced courses to offer our members, such as **Advanced Lifesaving Boat Emergency Training (ALBERT)** which was very well represented by North Steyne members and taught our IRB Drivers and Crew more advanced techniques and skills to ensure they are ready to respond to any situation.

Across the club there has also been training which is outside traditional awards-based training, it is an important part of the club's fabric. For example, training our surfboat crews and sweeps. I would like to thank David Maguire for his commitment to training multiple crews over the season which has led to some solid surfboat results at surf carnivals.

Thanks also to Col Stanford for his efforts in training up new crews and sweeps, including our first female sweep Ally Stirling, to ensure the knowledge is passed on to the next generation in this unique discipline.



Finally, I would like to thank our dedicated group of trainers for their efforts this season. Frank Traugott for mentoring Lochie Van der Pluijm and myself through our Training Officers award during two bronze courses under COVID conditions. I would also like to thank Lochie for his efforts with the Bronze training group this season as well. In terms of IRB I would like to thank David Guthrie, Richard Donaldson and Kyra Jenkins for ensuring we have competent drivers and crews. I would like to thank Cath in the office, who assisted with our administrative requirements including course waitlists, course paperwork, website updates, Team App access, sourcing external trainers, managing the award certificates and medallions and venue bookings.

Finally, a big thanks to my assistant David Guthrie for his enthusiasm and commitment to ensuring we are delivering the training needs to all our members.

Club Captain's Report

Season 2021/2022 will certainly be a year North Steyne can proudly look back on. From adapting our practices as health restrictions eased, to helping with the SLSNSW Flood Relief effort, or patrolling with the challenges of significant sand erosion, the North Steyne Lifesaving team has overcome every trial these eight months have thrown their way.

As my first year as Club Captain, it has been a privilege to support our incredible volunteers deliver top quality lifesaving services. The season began shrouded with uncertainty over who could patrol and how we would patrol. As December approached, health restrictions eased just in time for our peak season to begin. Even without tourism, our patrols saw some very challenging days on the sand, having to always remain vigilant, whether the sun was out, the rain drenching, or the wind high.



The team's major focus this year was to develop and begin implementation of a lifesaving strategy for the next few seasons. The theme of this strategy centres around patrol culture, fostering the growth of good leadership, reimagining how we can patrol effectively in a changing volunteer environment, and ensuring North Steyne produce the highest quality lifesavers for years to come.

This year the panel were successful in investing in our emergency response functions, increasing member agency and participation in lifesaving operations and enhanced transparency in lifesaving information at North Steyne.

More hands make lighter work. The Lifesaving Panel this year consisted of Kyra Jenkins (Assistant Club Captain), Dave Guthrie (IRB Captain/ Assistant Chief Training Officer), Matt Riordan (Patrols Coordinator), Paul Mathew (Medical Advisor), Steven Mastrangelo (Radio Officer), our 14 Patrol Captains and me. This fantastic team met every two months and deserve a huge thank you for their efforts this year. Together, we held

consistent discussions on both operational and strategic matters to make sure everyone within lifesaving was working towards a single goal.

The Lifesaving Panel worked on providing clear, relevant lifesaving information to members, in particular the Patrol Operations Manual and Lifesaving Procedures at the club. This involved updating the lifesaving information on the Club's website and additionally, throughout COVID-19 restrictions, putting together a variety of media to keep members informed and updated as restrictions changed.

Additionally, the Panel implemented two new initiatives to progress lifesaving practices at North Steyne. Special Occasion Patrols were offered for those wanting to get a group of friends together and spend a Saturday afternoon patrolling with people beyond their patrol. A group of Nipper parents utilised this and absolutely loved the atmosphere of their patrol.



Five of our more experienced lifesavers were also selected to run a skill sharing programme for our patrols. This programme allowed members to ask questions, develop skills and hone their lifesaving knowledge while patrolling, reducing the barriers to access the fantastic knowledge base North Steyne has. Thank you to Kyra Jenkins, Deb Foote, Shannon Job and Rebecca Chapman for helping facilitate this.



As an emergency service, Surf Life Saving will progressively be utilised more in emergency response functions in future seasons. As a club with a proud history and reputation within lifesaving, it is important for North Steyne to equip the club with the necessary tools and training to effectively respond to these situations. Season 2021/22 featured two after hours call outs locally, and a two-week long operation supporting SLSNSW with the NSW Flood Emergency. Our call out team, and volunteers who stepped up to help out in extraordinary circumstances have the club's gratitude for giving up their time and showcasing the club's impressive personnel.

With support from Northern Beaches Council under the Patrols Incentive Scheme, this season our 209 active patrolling members completed 10 rescues, 23 first aids and 141 preventative actions. The COVID-19 restrictions meant we faced some labour challenges, whether that be accessing the beach for those beyond our Local Government Area or ensuring our awards were covered. I am extremely proud that we consistently put together strong lifesaving teams and strived to exceed our minimum standards. I would like to especially thank our 30 volunteers who patrolled over 50 hours this season. These individuals consistently stepped up and helped with substitutions where necessary and always made sure our units were vigilant while on patrol.

A special thank you goes out to our fantastic Patrol Captains; Mark Stewart, James Townsend, Kyra Jenkins, Lachlan Van der Pluijm, Jeff Brown, Emma Hillier, Danny Gompes, Paul Mathew, Tim Platt, Neils Thelosen, David Cowell, Jodie Frazer and Jo Cooper, and Bernie Burrows. It was James and Neils' first year as Patrol Captain. Both were very impressive in organising and running their designated patrols.

Our IRBs required constant attention throughout the patrolling season. David Guthrie went above and beyond to ensure our hulls and motors were always operational. Additionally, the club named our new hull the Neil Purcell OAM. The occasion was a fantastic spectacle for those in attendance.

Finally, a thank you goes to the Assistant Club Captain Kyra Jenkins. This past season has been a steep learning curve and without her constant support and guidance, the Lifesaving portfolio wouldn't have achieved everything we have. This season has been an absolute joy to be Club Captain. I am looking forward to lifesaving at North Steyne next season and ensuring our beach is safe for our members and the public.

IRB Captain's Report

The Inflatable Rescue Boat (IRB) group spent this season getting back to basics and reinforcing the foundations of equipment, training and maintenance. It doesn't sound very exciting but the work done this season will ensure we continue to deliver reliable, capable rescue services to the community.

The season began with four new IRB Drivers (IRBDs) qualified, another new hull operational and skills maintained in a range of challenging environments. The club has more IRB assets than ever and this season we were able to put four IRBs on the water at one time.

Our two newest Type 1 soft hulls reinforce the Type 2 hard hull 'workhorses' of the fleet. Whilst we have been anticipating retiring the hard hulls, they were invaluable in floodwaters across the state when called upon to respond.

As one of only three clubs in the branch with these hard hulls, North Steyne SLSC was asked by SLSNSW to deploy on numerous occasions and our hard-working crewies and drivers were consistently up to the challenge. My thanks goes out to all those in the call-out teams or from the broader club who responded to requests for assistance. Your actions did not go unnoticed with SLSSNB and SLSNSW executive members consistently noting the contributions of your club through the long period of significant weather events.

Upskilling is hard to do for IRBD and IRB Crew (IRBC) because it requires experienced instruction, many assets and even more time given to training but North Steyne SLSC had the largest club group attend the Australian Lifesaving Boat Emergency Rescue Training (ALBERT) conducted at Dee Why beach in May. These new and revised skills will be reinforced with all IRB personnel to improve and sustain our ability to protect our community on Manly beach.

IRBD and IRBC from the club also spent a lot of time on the water providing safety for the many events run throughout the season. Those activities rely on the many hours these club members volunteer and couldn't happen without their support. That said, we always need more members to train for these awards. With some of our experienced IRBD and IRBC moving away for work in the last year, there are vacancies across the club, for patrols and the many other IRB tasks.

There will be IRB Diver and Crew training courses being held early each season and every surf lifesaver is encouraged to approach the IRB Captain or the Chief Training Officer to find out how to join the ranks.

Two great new awards were instituted this season recognising the IRBD and IRBC who have made a notable contribution to the club in the previous year. The awards not only recognise the contribution of time to the club but also individual skills development, teamwork and mentoring. The award of a brand new Surf Rescue lifejacket personalised with your name isn't a bad prize either. Congratulations to Brian Mariotti (IRBD) and Craig Shadbolt (IRBC) for being recognised this year.

Season 22/23 should be outstanding for IRBs with an additional two new outboard motors arriving, many more training and upskilling opportunities, and lots of fun to be had on the greatest beach in the world.

Youth Director's Report

It was certainly a challenging start to the 2021-22 season. Having only adjusted to unprecedented circumstances from last year, our planned off-season Youth training and social activities were once again placed on hold as we faced a longer COVID-19 lockdown period and newly imposed travel restrictions.

As a further blow, our Youth members could not immediately return to the beach once restrictions started to ease as there were vaccination requirements and public health orders in place, preventing our youngest patrolling members to re-join their patrols until November, several weeks after the start of the season.

Despite the late start, our Youth members returned to North Steyne with gusto, attending group training, proficiencies, patrols, surf sports events, and volunteering at club events.

Membership numbers have increased this season, up 145% on last season in the 13-15 years age group.

Additionally, the retention of older teens has also improved from last year, with a return of 65% of members in the 15-17 years age group, as opposed to only 54% for the season prior. Membership loss in the older age group is greatly impacted by patrol scheduling conflicts with teen weekend employment rosters and higher education study opportunities in areas outside of Sydney.

Education continues to play an important role in youth skills development to bolster patrol strengths and there have been several new Awards obtained by our young patrolling members throughout the season. This includes 20 Surf Rescue Certificate, eight Bronze, and 11 Provide First Aid. A big thank



you to all the trainers and assessors involved with their training programs. And a further thank you to parents and carers for your assistance with transport, set-up, pack up and rallying the teen troops as required.



Halfway through the season, Patrol 13 was repurposed into a Youth training patrol for North Steyne's teen members to practice their newly acquired skills and/or train for new awards in training scenarios, and in real-life patrol incidents.



This patrol also provided an opportunity for the SRC training group to remain together for the remainder of the season to gain first-hand experience on their new patrols next season. There were several fun, themed patrols including the Rainbow Beaches diversity and inclusion day and the Pink Patrol honouring SNB female members. We love a good excuse to dress up and wear colourful zinc! Thank you to Mark Stewart, Richard Donaldson, Jon Colwell, Stuart Crofton and Jo Cooper for your assistance on these patrols.

It was delightful to see the increased enthusiasm for surf sports from our Youth members this season, with participation across Water, Beach, Lifesaving and Boat disciplines. We also had representation in board and beach relays at Nipper carnivals in the newly introduced "U15 Youth" age group as well as Youth Aussies competitors trying out their skills at the Gold Coast in individual and team events. Congratulations to our Youth medallists for bringing home some "bling" and to all our Youth competitors for your dedication and hard work at training and on carnival days.

Thank you to all our club coaches and the North Steyne SLSC Surf Sports team for mentoring our Youth competitors.

North Steyne's Youth members continue to be active in many parts of the Club, offering weekly assistance with Nippers and Ripper Nippers water safety and beach coordination, assisting as event workforce volunteers at club-hosted carnivals including set up, water safety, BBQ and the First Aid tent, acting as course-helpers for the Northern Beaches Council Sun Run, supporting various functions at the Club Awards night, and providing water safety at other events including the 20 Twenty Cerebral Palsy swim.

We are very fortunate to have a committed group of community-minded young members, willing to give up their time for North Steyne SLSC initiatives and who are also juggling patrols, study, work, sports and life commitments throughout the season.

I would like to offer a big shout out to all my helpers throughout the season, particularly those that have assisted with Youth training. This long list includes: Kyra Jenkins, Frazer Richardson and my assistant Brian Mariotti for your help with SRCs and board training; Jo Cooper for general assistance with SRCs and their patrols; Dave Guthrie, Richard Donaldson and Mark Stewart for your assistance with IRB training; Club Trainers, Dan Hillier, Frank Traugott, Kyra Jenkins and Lachlan Van der Pluijm for your assistance with Bronze training; and a special thank you to Life Member, Keith Abraham, for successfully demonstrating to the SRC's how to use patrol signal flags on one breezy Sunday morning!

Thank you also to our SRC parents and Age Managers: Stuart and Chris Cofton, Di Phillips, Chris Haughton and Life Member, Jon Colwell.

Lastly, a very special thank you to all our youth members for your continued resilience for yet another roller-coaster season. I look forward to a fantastic season ahead.

Junior Activity Director's Report

With a late start, an early finish due to State, torrential rain, floods, existing through a pandemic, somehow, we managed to slot in a Nipper season with 14 Sunday mornings! With Brian finishing his time of service and leaving the Nipper crew, this season we took a broader team approach.

Although I may have been at the helm, it wouldn't have happened without my enthusiastic team, taking their roles to another level! Simon Herfort took over Sundays and the practical side of Nippers; Hillary looking after all the administration and the headaches that come; and Jon Colwell looked after everything to do with Water Safety with 100% success. We are all very proud that not a single incident form was filled out. Along with all the parent volunteers Nippers ran as one big team.

Our season kicked off on the first Sunday in November a month later than planned due to the Government restrictions on public gatherings. We took a different approach this season and broke the Nippers cohort into two groups. We moved to a 9am start and dropped the communal muster. Kids now went straight to their first area and started activities. We split Nippers by age, U6-8s went to the South of the club and U9-14s to the North. Two parents stepped up; Simon took the South & Diane "Di" Phillips the North. In the North Di co-ordinated so the kids all got a fair shake at each skill. Within U9-U14s we ran skill stations in a schedule including activities such as board, swimming, education, sprints and flags. The idea was as kids get older, they need to spend their time being challenged by new skills, not challenging our Age Managers.

The concept was for Age Managers to become kid managers and not need to be subject matter experts. The aim was to make it easier and more enjoyable for parents to get involved as age managers and age assistants. At each Station we would have a team of parents and coaches with the skill set to teach the kids thus not relying on an Age Assistants / Managers to do everything. To help visually represent the stations they had a tent and an associated colour: Beach – Yellow; Boards – Blue; Swim – Green.

Nipper Numbers

Like most sports, COVID-19 and the uncertainty surrounding it waned our overall numbers. This season 309 Nippers registered which was down 10% on 2020/21 season but higher than we anticipated.

Water Safety

This season Jon Colwell brought his skill set to the table. Jono engaged with the teenage SRC's and Bronzies to assist with water safety for Sunday Nippers. This was not only a great idea but a great success. A win-win as they say, parents got to keep their clothes on and stay dry on those cold days and our SRC developed their own skills! Age Managers

Before this season commenced, we conducted an online zoom Age Managers/Assistants course. This was run by Doug Howlett from Sydney Branch and was very successful with 50 parents taking part. From the Online course 35 parents completed the practical beach component on Sunday 31st October to become a fully qualified Age Managers. North Steyne Surf Boats

All boat rowers at North Steyne should be proud of this past season. It started with no access to boats or gym due to COVID-19 restrictions. Dedicated members trained at home. When restrictions eased, rowing machines were used in the boat shed and training returned to normal when the club reopened.

Time was spent on youth development with four U19 women, six U23 women, two U19 men, three U23 men as well as six Open men, four Open women, and 12 Masters men and women. It was great to see Bushrangers (Master's Men) and Watermen (Master's men) pull on their competition caps and enter some carnivals this season and the return of the Penguins (Masters women).



The A crew (The NEDs), included Sweep David Maguire, Matthew Gertenbach, Michael Bernerius, Scott Woodward, Oscar Cowell and Piers Haskard. With decades of international and domestic experience from flat water rowing, the crew had to master ocean rowing. The team built to be finals contenders in almost every elimination/ finals rounds they entered meaning they were in the top 15 Open A crews in Australia.

Highlights included rowing down the current national champions to finish 3rd at the Freshwater Carnival; competing in the finals at North Steyne; and rowing in 10ft plus surf at Kirra QLD. This crew (with the support of U23 men) also competed in Ocean Thunder this season which was made possible through the sponsorship from NED Australian Whisky. Thanks also to Manly Longboard Co. for keeping the crew looking the part with new branded clothing.

The Australian Surf Rowers League (ASRL) event at Elouera Beach this season was as big as the Australian Championships. Our Masters women came fourth in the 180+ division. Overnight horrendous conditions developed. Our nervous U23 women got off the beach like champions and caught the wave of the day to record their

first win in a competition, eventually making the quarterfinals. Our U23 men made it to the semi-finals against the best crews in Australia. Our NEDs crew made it to the finals day in horrendous surf and beat crews that have won the Australian Championships. Our Open women's crew (Nedettes) swept by Col Stanford, Ally Stirling, Sophie Egden, Antea Crevlin, and Laura with reserve Alex Salier performed well, but were unlucky not to proceed to finals day.

It's a dream of many crews at clubs around Australia to make a final or even finals day in any division. It takes dedication, hard training, surf skills, diligence and perseverance. The ASRL was such a wonderful event to see all the North Steyne crews competing against the best crews at the highest level.



At 'Aussies' our Masters men The Watermen, pictured above, came 4th in the 200+ men division, a fantastic achievement especially for Col Stanford in his retirement year. Our Masters women, The Penguins, came 6th in the 180+ women's division. They did us proud!

The Penguins formed late November 2021, Kate Munroe, Steph Stoddard, Melinda Akehurst (from Avalon) and Bastien Wallace (from Bronte), swept by David Maguire, had a brilliant season together in spite of disruptions which included racing cancellations for a tsunami warning at the Queenscliff Carnival, a shark incident near Elouera impacting the ASRL Masters' Day and flooding interrupting the State titles. They won silver at Branch, contested the ASRL with substitutes and were the only crew to make the alternate State racing. Like most crews, the Penguins were affected by COVID-19 but made it through to Aussies.

The U23 men's crew, The Outlaws swept by David Maguire, Nick Perry, Oscar Cowell, Pieter Marais and Zac Alford (replacing Ross Downey) came together at the end of last season. They

started well making it into the finals at Freshwater. Plagued by COVID-19 and lack of availability, the crew struggled until Zac came to the rescue. They placed second in a race at Queenscliff competing against Australian Champion crews. They made the finals at North Steyne, won a heat at the ASRL event and 4th in the semi-finals, beaten by three state representative crews who later took out the medals. At Aussies they won a heat against the best in Australia, but were unable to proceed to the finals after a harsh cut. Congratulations to Oscar Cowell awarded Boat Rower of the Year. Oscar stepped up to also be part of the NED crew, his skills as an oarsman have improved significantly.

Our U23 women (Shenanigans) of Chloe Woodward, Sarah Kinghorn, Olivia Kehoe, Abbey Hillier, and reserves Pip Rees-Evans, Emilia Cimino, with Sweep David Maguire, got great experience representing the Club at the Australian Young Guns Junior Surfboat Championships at Collaroy, the ASRL event and at Aussies.

A highlight of the season was the Gotcha4Life 24hour row event organised by our Boat Captain, Ally Stirling to raise money for mental health. It was an outstanding success and an awesome way to bring the community together at the start of the season. From Life Members to Cadets, with Surfboat crews and their friends and family, raising nearly \$8000 for the cause. Founder Gus Worland, pictured below with Ally, popped in to encourage the rowers to keep going, and show his support.

It has been a big season overall, with Boaties helping at BBQs, carnival set-ups, pack-downs, officiating and enjoying supporting other crews throughout the season. A huge thanks to David for all the super early starts, boat and equipment wrangling, to all our supporters and NED Australian Whisky for a great season.

Treasurer's Report

I am pleased to present the Financial Reports for 2022 for North Steyne SLSC on behalf of the Board of Directors.

The Club had another strong financial year, posting a net surplus of \$79,502. This results in us increasing our accumulated earnings to \$637k (before special purpose funds). Within our Balance Sheet equity, we also made our largest year-end contribution to the Club's Future Fund in several years, taking our balance to circa \$250,000. This result was driven by a Sales (Bar, BBQ and Clothing Shop) increase of 4% and an Other Income increase of 22%. Both items involve substantial volunteer efforts from our membership, in particular running the BBQ on Sundays during the season and working at North Steyne's hosted carnivals and events that have grown as a fundraising source over the past couple of years.

However, financial success is not simply measured in revenue and surpluses. Equally important is that the treasury funds the Club's execution of its strategic goals and continues to provide equipment and support for members and for our core activities. This year, we spent \$315,703 in total expenditure and additionally funded \$53k of new capital expenditure, which met all sectional requests through the season.

Beyond the numbers, I was pleased to see increased financial discipline - particularly spend discipline - from the Board, whom I congratulate on delivering a positive result vs our budget at the net surplus line, primarily driven by judicious spending to save money where appropriate. We have begun to consolidate supplier relationships through our Admin Manager and this will continue into 2022-23. We also embarked on a campaign of "aggressive simplification" during the season, which included a shift to digital payroll and timesheets, a substantial reduction in the size of our chart of accounts, faster spend approvals, automation of our fixed asset register, and consolidation of 50% of our bank accounts.

Surf Life Saving and North Steyne SLSC have received ongoing government support and would like to acknowledge:

- The NSW Government for the support of Resilience NSW for the ongoing funding of state-side operations, which benefit all members through our cooperative agreement.
- The NSW Government for the support of the Office of Sport, for their support to increase usage, safety and participation in Surf Life Saving through ongoing programs and the Department of Communities & Justice Building Partnership Program.
- Federal Government for the Beach Safety Equipment Funding which directed \$5,000 to every SLSC for the purchase of vital rescue equipment, first aid and medical supplies.
- Federal Government for the VET Funding which enabled hundreds of assessors to update their training qualifications and provided clubs with updated training equipment including QCPR manikins and tablets.
- The NSW and Federal Governments for its support of small organisations through JobKeeper and other COVID-19 grants and rebates.

The Surf Life Saving Foundation has also provided support to Surf Life Saving organisations such as North Steyne SLSC; please refer to our financial statements for a breakdown of our expenditure from total fundraising contributions this season.

Finally, I would like to acknowledge the contributions of several key people this season: George Van Dyck was Club Treasurer for the first half of the season before moving overseas for work and initiated several of the successful changes mentioned above; Cath Hillier as Admin Manager has made several important improvements to our financial processes and I look forward to this to continue next year; Tony Falzarano as previous treasurer for a thorough handover and ongoing support; Trevor Lane as our Honorary Auditor for continual advice throughout the season and support on our grant submissions; and Chris Stewart & Frank Traugott for their regular inputs and oversight of Board matters.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the 13-month period ended 31 May 2022

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following explains the significant accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the financial statements. Unless otherwise stated, such accounting policies were also adopted in the corresponding reporting period.

General

The financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial report preparation requirements of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission and Charitable Fundraising Act 1991. The board has determined that the club is not a reporting entity. North Steyne Surf Life Saving Club Inc ("**NSSLSC**") is a not-for-profit entity for the purpose of preparing the financial statements.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 and the following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements specified by the Australia Accounting Standards and Interpretations issues by the AASB and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 'Presentation of Financial Statements', AASB 107 'Statement of Cash Flows', AASB 108 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors', AASB 1048 'Interpretations of Standards', and AASB 1054 'Additional Disclosures' as appropriate for not-for-profit oriented entities.

Basis of accounting

The statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values, or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

Estimates and judgments are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that may have a financial impact on the entity and that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

In F2022, NSSLSC has streamlined its expense and fixed asset accounts to organise these by expense type and by club section. Categorisation of expenses and fixed assets in the Notes to the Accounts for F2021 have been adjusted where applicable to present a like-for-like comparison.

Registration fees

All registration fees are bought to account in the year to which they apply as and when received from the members. Capitation fees, due to Surf Life Saving New South Wales Inc and Sydney Northern Beaches Surf Life Saving, are remitted as and when invoiced and shown as a separate expenditure item.

Donations and sponsorship income

Donations & sponsorship income is recognised when amounts are received or receivable.

Grants

Grants are recognised in the same period as the related expense or asset is recognised. Grants received in advance are shown as deferred income.

Government Assistance

Government assistance represents JobKeeper payments and other COVID-19-based funding from the NSW Government.

Cash at bank

Cash at bank and term deposits represents monies deposited with Bank of Queensland.

Inventories

Inventories have been valued at the lower of replacement cost and net realisable value.

Property, plant and equipment

- i. Property, plant and equipment are carried at cost, independent of directors' valuations.
- ii. Over the years, NSSLSC has collected considerable memorabilia. These memorabilia were originally recorded at a nominal value but has subsequently been fully depreciated to zero - hence the financial accounts do not ascribe any value to memorabilia assets
- iii. The cost of the day to day servicing of property, plant and equipment is recognised in the profit and loss as incurred
- iv. Depreciation rates are defined according to useful lives in NSSLSC's Treasury Policy and for each major class of asset are:

All key management personnel (NSSLSC Directors and Officers) are not compensated in those roles.

NOTE 3 – SEGMENT INFORMATION

NSSLSC derives revenue primarily from its members, sponsors, and fundraising activities to support its role in providing beach life saving services and operations. NSSLSC's activities are principally carried out at Manly Beach in NSW.

NOTE 4 – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

We expect the continuing COVID-19 pandemic and related restrictions will impact our operations substantially less than in the past 2-3 seasons.

Our Lifesaving Services Agreement is on similar terms and levels as this past season and we continue to operate under the same terms and conditions as per our license agreement, now expired.

NOTE 5 – RECONCILIATION OF CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS
