I would also like to thank Dan Hillier for all his work with administration, and Shannon Job for keeping a watchful eye over our finances.

We said good-bye to our Administration Manager Cath Hillier at the close of last season, and I would like to thank her for all her hard work in that role. We welcomed Tara McKnight to the role, and she has fit right in and is doing a great job for the Club.

Our AGM in 2022 was very special as we awarded Life Membership to Deb Foote and Frank Traugott. Deb and Frank are 2 very deserving individuals who have both dedicated countless hours to our Club. Deb is our first female Life Member and I can't think of anyone more deserving to have this honour.

The NSW State Championships ran for 3 weeks in February/March and our beach was the centre point for most of the competition. Thank you to all those who volunteered and lent a hand during the event. Whether on the BBQ, behind the bar or helping on the beach, we greatly appreciated all your support! We certainly fed a lot of hungry people and we have smashed all BBQ records for the most sausages served. A special thanks to Surf Life Saving NSW, Queenscliff SLSC and the Northern Beaches Council for their teamwork to ensure this event was a great success.

Our competitors did us proud this season. Under the guidance and encouragement of Coach Tom, our Nippers had some impressive results including



a 4th in the All Age Board Relay at the NSW Junior State Championships. Our Ripper Nippers competed with great enthusiasm and came top of the table in the Inclusive Champions. Our Surfboat Masters Women finished 1st in the Super Vets Category in the George Bass Surfboat Marathon. At Aussies in Perth, we had a very strong team and congratulations to Sarah Lally for a BRONZE in Champion Lifesaver (30-39 years) and a SILVER in the 2km swim (30-39 years). Also congrats to Erin Colwell for getting a BRONZE in 2 km swim (30-39 years).

Our Ocean Swim was held on Sunday, 16 April and we had a great turnout on the day. It was so good to be holding it again, and thanks for Jodie Frazer for all her hard work in organising the event.

The flags come down on ANZAC Day which is a special time to remember those who served and reflect on just how lucky we are. Our IRB Captain, Major Dave Guthrie, laid a wreath on behalf of all our members at the Manly Dam Dawn Service.

Our awards night in May wrapped up the season. The mighty Patrol 11 won the coveted Patrol of the Year for all their outstanding efforts over the season. Our Club Person of the year was Kyra Jenkins who spent countless hours conducting training, ensuring we were compliant, and just being around the Club to lend a hand.

Congratulations to our competitors for all your success this year and well done to Sarah Lally and Deb Foote for driving this portfolio to continue to grow and succeed.

The multiple North Steyne BBQ teams were back at it again this season with increased shifts across all "A" teams plus other collective areas of the club helping out. The BBQs this year were a great success with an increase in activity for carnivals, events and particularly the State Championships which resulted in a very successful financial result for the club. Thank you to our BBQ teams for all their hard work across the season and we look forward to seeing you back next year.

Education Director's Report

This season was busy for the education team and the Club with a broad offering of courses available to new and current patrolling members. In addition, this season was the first since the start of the pandemic that we returned to live demonstrations of all assessment tasks across all of the awards.

As my first season as Chief Training Officer I was particularly proud of the number of members who up-skilled this season and took on the challenge of gaining a new award. I would particularly like to recognise the members who completed multiple new awards in the course of this season.

Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC)

The Surf Rescue Certificate is the first award that younger members can attain to begin patrolling the beach in their red and yellows. This award is usually undertaken as candidates are U14 and represents the end of the nipper's journey as they move into the cadets' program. This season we had 15 younger members complete their SRC. A special thanks must go to Jo Cooper and Jodie Frazer for all of their efforts and time with this group.

It was impressive to see the skills both in and out of the water attained by these young members. In addition, during their training it was impressive to see the positive comradery between candidates and their positive attitude towards one and other.

As our future patrolling membership, I am confident and excited about the years ahead on the beach for North Steyne.

In addition, this season we had 8 adult candidates attain their SRC so that they can support water safety within Nippers and Youth programs. Thanks for this must go to Simon Hertford and Jono Colwell.



I hope you can join me in congratulating all of these members on completing their SRC.

Bronze Medallion

The Bronze Medallion is the entry level lifesaving qualification and provides the basic skills both in and out of the water for patrol



operations, as such this is our most important award.

After the difficulties in running in person training over the last few seasons, this season was the first we were able to return to two annual bronze courses. A total of 33 bronze candidates completed their bronze this season, which will help to strengthen our patrolling numbers. These courses were run with a mix of members who were new to the club and members upgrading from the Surf Rescue Certificate.

Being personally involved with both of these groups it was impressive to see the dedication and the positive attitudes that these candidates brought to training. In particular, the teamwork displayed across the diverse candidature bodes well for these members being on patrol.

In addition to our two standard courses, this season an additional 4 members completed a return to bronze course and re-attained their Bronze Medallion after a period away from Surf Lifesaving. Thanks to Frank Traugott for working with this group and helping to update their skills to the latest course outlines.

Congratulations to all of these members for their efforts in completing their bronze and I look forward to seeing you all on the beach.

Higher Awards

Advance Resuscitation Techniques ('ART')

This season, a new award the HLTAID015 was introduced to supersede previous advance resuscitation awards. This



new course has been designed around best practice learnings for effective response to life-threatening respiratory and circulatory emergencies. A larger focus has been placed on practical tasks, including the use of bleeding simulators. The course is one of the more challenging courses offered in the SLS emergency care pathway and it was great to see so many members interested in taking the course.

We had a total of 22 members complete this new award, which will allow these members to bring new capabilities and skills to their patrols.

IRB Awards

The IRB is the most commonly used rescue tool across surf lifesavers in New South Wales and greatly increases a patrols ability to respond to emergencies. The IRB is particularly useful for longer distance rescues, Search and Rescue operations and responding to marine creatures.

The IRB Crew Course equips candidates with the skills to crew an IRB across a variety of surf conditions. This season we ran two IRB crew courses with Richard Donaldson, Kyra Jenkins and Dave Guthrie all being involved in training, and 6 members attained their IRB crew certificate.

The IRB Drivers Course extends a crew person's skills to include driving an IRB in a range of surf conditions and covers other skills such as search patterns and maritime laws that are vital to effectively using the IRB. All patrols on the beach need an IRB driver, and hence it is a very valuable award. This season 4 members completed their IRB driver qualification.

First Aid

Providing First Aid is a vital skill on patrol and a major part of what we do on the beach. The First Aid course provides members with a broader skill set to treat a wider range of injuries. In addition, the First Aid Certificate has become more important as it is now a prerequisite to complete the ART award. Members are required to complete the



First Aid course every three years to stay current. This season 30 members obtained the First Aid Certificate.

Other Awards

The Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue award covers advanced search and rescue techniques, navigating difficult marine environments and complex rescues. This course was completed by 2 members this season.

The Silver Medallion Patrol Captains award supersedes the previous Beach Management award held in previous seasons. This is the prerequisite award for becoming a patrol captain. Due to the change in course there were few opportunities for members to participate this season, however we have multiple members enrolled to complete the course over the winter.

The Rescue Watercraft Operators award covers the operation of RWCs (Jet Skis) for surf lifesaving purposes and can only be completed by members who are already qualified IRB drivers. This course is usually run over the winter and is very time intensive to complete. Congratulations to the two members who completed this award this season.

Proficiencies

Proficiencies are always a very busy start to the season and this year was no different. Through the hard work of our delegates and our trainers we were able to run sessions across the first half of the season and have the vast majority of members proficient and ready to patrol for another season. In addition, thank you to all of our patrolling members who took the time to come down to the club and complete their proficiency.

Compliance

Our training and education this season complied with the Vocation and Education Traing (VET) requirements as dictated by the SLS governing bodies. The broader education team met for a panel meeting and the re-endorsement process was followed for all trainers. In addition, all gear was inspected and passed the pre-season gear



Trainers and Assessors

Our training would not happen without the dedication of our trainers and assessors in the Club. Particularly the quality of candidates that have been presented to assessment this season is a testament to the quality of teaching from our trainers. Thank you to the trainers for all of your time, effort and dedication to training our lifesavers.

This season we have had the opportunity to expand the education team, we have had two previous trainers re-endorse to return to training and have had three members undertake the Training Officer Certificate to start training groups. In addition, many of our current trainers expanded their skill sets this season, three trainers were endorsed to teach the new advance resuscitation award, and one trainer became endorsed to instruct both the IRB crew and IRB driver award.


Training has been one of the most rewarding things I have done personally within surf lifesaving, and I would highly recommend it to anyone who is considering it. The Club and the Branch are always willing to support new members attaining their training officers award and if you are interested, I would recommend speaking to one of the current trainers.

The other part of running courses is assessing. Thank you to all of our assessors who gave up their time to attend assessments across the Branch. We as a Club are required to supply assessors for every assessment that we present candidates, and without your efforts we would be unable to present candidates.

Overall, this season has been highly productive in the education space, and I can confidently say that we have increased the skill set across our members to patrol the beach. Next season I would encourage everyone to get involved in a new award and learn new skills for both on and off the beach.

Finally, a special thanks must go to my assistant Kyra Jenkins. Kyra has been an excellent source of guidance as a previous Chief Training Officer and has been involved in all of the training across all of the different awards, turning up to every course enthusiastic and with a smile.

Club Captain's Report

Season 2022/2023 will certainly be a year North Steyne can proudly look back on. From continuing to adapt our practices, to helping with the SLSNSW Flood Relief effort, or providing water safety for events, the North Steyne Lifesaving team has risen to all this season's challenges.

As my second year as Club Captain, it has been a privilege to support our incredible volunteers to deliver top quality lifesaving services. This season saw the return of tourists and crowds, with challenging conditions constantly pushing our patrols and showing the quality of patroller we have at North Steyne.

The team's major focus this year was to build off last year and deliver systems which help volunteer satisfaction when lifesaving at North Steyne. We were successful in innovating our patrol storage systems by optimising the layout of our IRB shed and saw our grant purchases put to good use with the addition of a patrol marquee and umbrellas. The panel also introduced a new technology called Swapsea, which helped our volunteers better connect with each other when trying to find substitutes.

More hands make lighter work. The Lifesaving Panel this year consisted of Dave Guthrie (Assistant Club Captain), Jon Holman (Lifesaving Advisor), Emilie Morris (Lifesaving Advisor), Emma Winter (Lifesaving Advisor), our 14 Patrol Captains and me. This fantastic team deserves a huge thank you for their efforts this year. Together, we held consistent discussions on both operational and strategic matters to make sure everyone within lifesaving was working towards a single goal.

As an emergency service, Surf Life Saving will progressively be utilised more in emergency response functions in future seasons. As a Club with a proud history and reputation within lifesaving, it is important for North Steyne to equip the Club with the necessary tools and training to effectively respond to these situations. This season saw members, in particular Shane O'Neil and Dave Guthrie, give up their time to offer their support to SLSNSW operations in Western NSW during the flood crisis. Our call out team, and volunteers who stepped up to help out in extraordinary circumstances have the club's gratitude for giving up their time and showcasing the club's impressive personnel.

Additionally, the Lifesaving team helped with two new events to progress life saving practices at North Steyne. We were approached by a movie production company to help out with water safety on a big budget film set. The experience was fantastic for those involved, our volunteers getting to ensure the safe practicing of stunt testing and live filming over several months. We also helped Kap7 with the Bobby Memorial Ocean Swim to kick off the AQuA Festival



for World Pride Day in February 2023. Michael Altenburger and Craig Shadbolt supported both these events and deserve special praise for their efforts.

This season, our active patrolling members completed 46 rescues, 45 first aids and over 1,300 preventative actions (up from just over 100 last year). I am extremely proud that we consistently put together strong lifesaving teams and strived to exceed our minimum standards. I would like to especially thank our 24 volunteers who patrolled over 50 hours this season. These individuals consistently stepped up and helped with substitutions where necessary and always made sure our units were vigilant while patrolling.

A special thank you goes out to our fantastic Patrol Captains; Mark Stewart, James Townsend, Kyra Jenkins, Lachlan Van der Pluijm, Jeff Brown, Emma Hillier, Danny Gompes, Paul Mathew, Tim Platt, Neils Thelosen, David Cowell, Jodie Frazer and Jo Cooper, and Bernie Burrows. Another strong year from our frontline leaders who continue to set high standards for patrolling.

Finally, a thank you goes to the Assistant Club Captain Dave Guthrie. His dedication to constantly improving the IRB department in addition to supporting the wider Life Saving portfolio cannot be understated. I don't think I can remember many weekends where he wasn't down at the club either training, patrolling, doing maintenance or just saying hi to the patrol.

Overall, this season has been an absolute joy to be Club Captain. I am immensely looking forward to next season and what comes next for lifesaving at North Steyne.



Youth Director's Report

The key goals of North Steyne's Youth portfolio aims to:

- Promote personal development and self-confidence among Youth members;
- Facilitate community involvement and volunteerism;
- · Foster a sense of belonging and inclusivity;
- Provide educational and skill building opportunities;
- · Advocate for youth-related issues and raise awareness.

Based on the achievements this season, the Youth portfolio has really smashed these goals. Our younger patrolling members were highly active this season, engaging in

a diverse range of activities including patrols, educational training, group fitness sessions and surf sports competitions. Additionally, they offered water safety assistance and volunteered their time at Club

and community events, showcasing their dedication to their community and their passion for surf lifesaving.

This season's membership numbers in the 13-15 years age group have increased by 137% compared to last season. However, the retention of older teens has decreased slightly, with only 41% of members in the 15-17 years age group returning (compared to 64% last season). This decline in membership can be attributed to a lower starting base as we had fewer Cadets coming through during COVID lockdown seasons. This situation has been exacerbated by scheduling conflicts with weekend employment, study commitments and higher-education opportunities outside of Sydney, affecting our older Youth membership cohort.

Youth skills development is greatly enhanced by education, and I am proud to announce that our Youth cohort have achieved several new awards this season. This includes 15 Surf Rescue Certificates, 24 Bronze Medallion Awards, 17 Provide First Aid, 4 ART Awards and 5 IRB Crew Certificates. I would like to extend my gratitude to all trainers and assessors who have contributed to their training programs. Also, a big thank you to parents and carers for their support in providing transportation, setting up, packing up, and rallying Youth members to attend training and assessments.

Prior to the season start, North Steyne SLSC accommodated a group of 12 boys and their supervisors from the Dubbo South Clontarf Academy. The group participated in a lifesaving skills day which was facilitated by our Club Captain, Jack Watt, accompanied by several Youth members to demonstrate board paddling, wave catching, CPR and first aid. It was a lovely exchange of skills which culminated in a very competitive (friendly!) beach touch footy game between

both entities which we eventually called a draw. The boys from the Academy are looking forward to their next visit and a game rematch.

North Steyne also accommodated another Youth group from Torquay SLSC in December 2022. The group joined our Youth and Club members at the regular Sunday morning board training session and mentored our SRCs-in-training for the paddle-out. It was great to host the Torquay youth group that weekend and we look forward to paying them a visit in return in the coming season(s).

We have seen increased enthusiasm for surf sports from our Youth members again this season, with participation across water, beach, and lifesaving disciplines and representation at Branch, State and Aussies competitions. Congratulations to all our Youth competitors for your hard work at training and also to those that managed to bring home some "bling". In my eyes, you are all Black and Gold Champions.





Congratulations to Emilie Morris for her selection in the SLSNSW Youth Opportunity Makers (YOM) Workshop this season. She joins a legacy of North Steyne Youth members that have participated in this workshop and have gone on to leadership roles at North Steyne SLSC. No pressure then, Emily!

I would like to offer a big shout-out to all my helpers throughout the season, particularly those that have assisted with Youth training. This season we had:


- Over 300 Nippers, U6-U14

This season the North Steyne Antiques, Defibrillators and Steyne Alive all did the Club proud.

Four of the North Steyne Antiques were first out of the blocks with the 10km Burleigh Griffin Gift in Canberra on the 1st of October 2022 with crew Kate Munro, Donna Wishart Kerri McEwan, Beverley Tilbury and sweep David Maguire. Conditions were chilly and wet and a perfect preparation for the George Bass.

Then the Steyne Alive crew consisting of Lara Husselby, Kate Munro, Bastian Wallace, Claire Ward and Sophie Egden kicked their season off with the North Curl Curl, Freshwater and Newport carnivals. Unfortunately, La Nina was hanging around, making some of the training and competition conditions more exciting.

On New Year's Day David Maguire, Gem Eastwood, Philippa Lowe, Kerry McEwan, Kate Munro, Steph Stoddart, Bastien Wallace and Donna Wishart began the 2024 George Bass Surfboat Marathon of 7 days of 7 legs from Batemans Bay to Eden. This was the 48th year of the event, and the crew encountered some tough conditions.

The North Steyne Antiques contested the female Super-Vets category, and were the only crew to row in fixed seats. Other crews expressed sympathy, thinking our row would be harder than theirs because of this. But our girls were prepared to handle the waves leaving and returning to shore, taking the race pin-up photo, as other crews struggled in rolling seats.

Race organisers and crews responded well to tough conditions, and the need to change the format for 4 of the 7 legs of the race. Cold wind, sunburned legs, shark sightings, bruises, support boat engine issues, and Bastien's fish-feeding efforts, didn't stop the North Steyne Antiques from setting race records for 3 of the 7 legs and bringing home a gold medal.

Then it was back to warmer conditions for Steyne Alive at the North Steyne Carnival in January with the Terrigal carnival in the first weekend in February.

La Nina had a last blast on Thursday the 9th of February, totally flooding out the ASRLMasters competition and forcing everyone to leave. Thankfully the crew was able to get some reserve racing in the following day, and raced well in spite of the disrupted format.

The SNB Branch Champs at Collaroy saw the first race for the North Steyne Defibrillators, made up of Dan Hillier, Richard Donaldson, Mark Stewart and Brian Baker swept by Dave Maguire. They brought home gold in the 220 years. Steyne Alive raced masters and won the race but was disqualified for missing a gate can. A solid effort in reserve grade and good preparation for State.

State Titles saw all the training and hard work pay off for Steyne Alive, who became the 2023 New South Wales State Champions taking home a well deserved gold in masters 160 years women's division. The crew then backed up with a solid performance in reserve grade.

The North Steyne Defibrillators also put in a good performance in Masters in the 220 category.

All that was left was the drive across Australia to Aussies in Perth for David Maguire with a boatload of all the Clubs competition gear supporting the Nippers and lifesaving team.

Conditions at Aussies were windy and flat with a 'lovely' drop-off and occasional shore dump. North Steyne Alive competed well against all the State Champions from around Australia. A great 3rd and another 3rd put the crew in a good position for the final, but a 6th in the final heat left the crew 7th in Australia and out of the final. The crew then raced in the reserve division performing fantastic and making the elimination finals round for reserves. Wonderful to see hard work and dedication pay off for the crew and sweep.

Thanks to all the crews who did an outstanding job supporting the Club. The Boat Section contributed on patrols, BBQ duties, supported the NSW championship, fundraising, sponsorship, and IRB shifts.









North Steyne Surf Club - Annual Ocean Swim

The North Steyne Ocean Swim finally returned to the ocean swim calendar for 2023 after being put on hold for several seasons due to COVID lockdowns and unfavourable weather conditions. This event is highly regarded by those in the circuit as one of the best ocean swims, and its return was warmly welcomed by both swim participants and club members.

This year's swim had two courses. The first was the longer 2.8km swim that went south to Cabbage Tree Bay, turned towards Manly, and then headed back north to North Steyne's shores. The second was a 1km swim that started at North Steyne and went towards Manly before turning at a buoy and returning to North Steyne for the finish.

This year's swim event only allowed online entries to better manage swim administration, work party and water safety resources on the day of the event. The deadline for entries was 3 pm on Saturday. As a result of this decision, there was a surge in entries during the last few hours leading up to the deadline on oceanswims.com. As is now the norm, most swimmers wait until the last minute to register after checking the weather and conditions for the following day.

On the days prior to the event, the beach had been closed due to pollination from rain run-off which had put the event in doubt. Fortunately, by Saturday the sun was shining, the water had cleared up, and the event was given the green light. The waves were calm at North Steyne and the next day's swim forecast looked promising...

However, true to form, North Steyne's capricious nature took hold overnight and by Sunday morning, there were swirling rips, grey clouds, a few showers and a 3ft+ swell. The conditions provided some challenges with buoy placement and water safety, with a decision to adjust some of the 1km swim cans within 2.8km course. Most swimmers were not deterred by mother nature on the day, though a few participants chose not to back up their hardy 2.8km efforts with an additional 1km swim.

At 5.30 am on Sunday morning, our dedicated volunteers helped with setting up the beach, registration hall, and water courses. They placed course buoys and markers while Dave Cowell's set-up crew assembled pop-up tents and assisted with the finish funnel and sponsor banners and flags to add some vibrancy to the event. The beach was starting to come to life as everything took shape.

In the hall, past and present club member volunteers of all ages arrived at 6 am and very capably managed the registrations of 322 registered swimmers that were marked off, capped, tagged, numbered and ready for their wave of the swim. Thank you to all our regular and new helpers for your efforts both in the hall and on the beach.

Thanks also to North Steyne Nipper, Joel Colwell, for taking time out from the registration desk to deliver the Acknowledgement of Country just prior to the start of the first event.

Our reliable team of IRB drivers and crew, led by Richard Donaldson and overseen by Keith Abraham, did an excellent job of laying out the course. North Steyne's IRB Captain Dave Guthrie opted for a ski over an IRB this year and ably coordinated water safety personnel from the SNB Event Support Ski. Club Captain, Jack Watt, took on the important role of coordinating overall water safety from the beach, assisted by Branch-appointed SEMC James Crittenden.

Our First Aid crew attended 4 first-aid incidents on the day but all patients were released well and warm by the conclusion of the event. Thank you to Jo Cooper, Emma Winter, Anthony Kwan, Kyra Jenkins, Lachlan Van der Pluijm for your sterling efforts.

Despite the tough conditions, it was a great turnout for the event with 130 registrations for the 1km swim with 80 finishers and 192 registrations for the more challenging 2.8km swim, with 161 completing the longer course. It's no surprise that the 2.8km swim was more popular as it offers a chance to appreciate the beautiful underwater scenery around Cabbage Tree Bay.









Well done to all the swimmers who completed the courses and a big thanks to the water safety teams for ensuring a safe and enjoyable event. We received many positive reviews and are looking forward to hosting an even bigger event next year for our 23rd ocean swim at North Steyne.

The swim times this year were a little slower than in previous years, proving that water conditions can have an impact on competitive swim times. However, swimmers were reassured by the presence of our highly qualified and experienced water safety crew including IRB's operated by trained drivers and crew in the water, water safety personnel on rescue boards, and swimmers equipped with rescue tubes. All these measures were in place to provide safety coverage along the course and on the shoreline near the start/finish line.

The success of the event is attributed to all the dedicated volunteers who helped with various tasks such as setting up the water and beach areas, registering, tagging/de-tagging participants, cutting and distributing fruits, ensuring water safety, providing first aid, and cleaning up after the event. The swimmers expressed their gratitude to the volunteers during the event and I would like to extend a big congratulations to all of those involved to ensure the success of this year's ocean swim. The A-Team, who ran a fantastic BBQ, deserves special thanks. Thank you also to event MC John Kelly and also to Roger Harvey for supplying event photos.

Additionally, the Balgowlah RSL and its Directors, who served as the primary sponsor, are appreciated for their continued support.

I would like to extend a special thanks to Tara, North Steyne's Administration Manager, for all her efforts to expedite applications, rally suppliers and distribute prizes to the winners. Treasurer's Report

I am pleased to present the Financial Reports for 2023 for North Steyne SLSC on behalf of the Board of Directors.

The Club had another strong financial year, posting a net surplus of \$45,745. This results in us increasing our accumulated earnings to \$665k (before special purpose funds). We have allocated additional savings to the Future Fund, bringing the balance to \$268k.



The Club has had extremely strong sales through BBQ activity led by Claire Oxlade over peak summer and the SLSNSW Championships hosted on our beach in late February. Our members have done an excellent job in supporting these activities as well as growing Income through our hosting commitments for SLSNSW and other local carnivals, running our first successful Ocean Swim since COVID-19 led by Jodie Frazer, and a record year in Function Hire of our hall and facilities.

Our financial discipline built last financial year has continued into F23, with the Board delivering a positive result vs our budget at the net surplus line, primarily through reduced spending. This yielded a \$47k improvement vs the budgeted result. The Board is managing a fine balance between disciplined spending to achieve savings versus overbalancing towards a chronic under-spend, and should monitor this throughout F24 to ensure high-quality, safe facilities are still being provided to the membership.

The Club is well-placed financially to improve facilities for its members and to make lives easier for our key volunteers. Several projects are planned for the 2023 off-season to improve the building and facilities; these will need ongoing focus from Directors and from key members to ensure successful outcomes and good value for money ready for the 2023-24 season.

This year, we have introduced reporting of North Steyne SLSC's carbon emissions from Scope 1, 2, and 3 activities per the global Greenhouse Gas Protocol (GHGP). While the figures produced at this stage are estimates only and have not been subjected to independent assurance, we have followed the GHGP's key principles for estimates and established a starting point on which to improve in future seasons.

Finally, I would like to acknowledge the contributions of: Tara McKnight as our new Office Administrator for F23, who has kept our financial and payment processes running smoothly as well as growing our function hire revenue; Philip Du, who has stepped up this season as Assistant Treasurer and overseen both Fixed Asset management and monthly Board financial reporting; and Trevor Lane as our Honorary Auditor for continual advice throughout the season and assurance over our financial statements.

The financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial report preparation requirements of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission and Charitable Fundroising Act 1991. The board has determined that the club is not a reporting entity. North Steyne Surf Life Saving Club Inc ("NSSLSC") is a not-for-profit entity for the purpose of preparing the financial statements. NSSLSC is an Association incorporated in NSW, operating under the Associations Incorporation Act 2009.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 and the following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements specified by the Australia Accounting Standards and Interpretations issues by the AASB and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101. Presentation of Financial Statements', AASB 107 'Statement of Cash Flows', AASB 108 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors', AASB 1048 'Interpretations of Standards', and AASB 1054 'Additional Disclosures' as appropriate for not-for-profit oriented entities.

Basis of accounting

The statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values, or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

Estimates and judgments are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that may have a financial impact on the entity and that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

In FXI23, Clothing Sales have been considered as a fundraising activity alongside other sales: activities (Bar and BBQ).

Registration fees

All registration fees are brought to account in the year to which they apply as and when received from the members. Capitation fees, due to Surf Life Saving New South Wales Inc and Sydney Northern Beaches Surf Life Saving, are remitted as and when invoiced and shown as a separate expenditure item.

Donations and sporsorship income

Donations & sponsorship income is recognised when amounts are received or receivable.

Grants

Grants are recognised in the same period as the related expense or asset is recognised. Grants received in advance are shown as deferred income.

Government Assistance

Government assistance represents JobKeeper payments and other COVID-19-based funding from the NSW Government, appearing in the F2022 comparatives.

Cash at bank

Cash at bank and term deposits represents monies deposited with Bank of Queensland.

Inventories.

Inventories have been valued at the lower of replacement cost and net realisable value.

Property, plant and equipment

- Property, plant and equipment are carried at cost, independent of directors' valuations.
- ii. Over the years, NSSLSC has collected considerable memorabilia. These memorabilia were originally recorded at a nominal value but has subsequently been fully depreciated to zero hence the financial accounts do not ascribe any value to memorabilia assets
- ii. The cost of the day to day servicing of property, plant and equipment is recognised in the profit and loss as incurred

MSSLSC derives revenue primarily from its members, sponsors, and fundraising activities to support its rule in providing beach life saving services and operations. MSSLSC's activities are principally carried out at Manly Beach in NSW.

NOTE 4 - SUBSECUENT EVENTS

Our Lifesaving Services Agreement is on similar terms and levels as this past season and we continue to operate under the same terms and conditions as per our license agreement, now expired.

Carbon Reporting Estimate

In line with SLS strategic objectives and NSSLSC's own environmental focus, NSSLSC has taken steps to monitor and estimate its carbon footprint in F23 for the first time. NSSLSC has a strong incentive to champion responsible environmental management, not just as custodians of the middle third of Manly beach as an important community asset, but also as a likely frontline impact of projected sea level rises driven by climate change.

MSSLSC has adopted principles from the Global Green House Gas Protocol (GHGP), the leading international initiative to standardise emissions reporting for organisations.

MSSLSC's emissions¹ reporting is intended as an *estimate* to guide future internal decision making only. While reasonable efforts have been made to adhere to the GHGP requirements, our non-financial reporting is not governed by internal controls and has not been subject to independent assurance.

The GHGP separates emissions reporting into three scopes²:

- Scope 1: emissions from NSSLSC's direct operations including transport.
- 2. Scope 2: MSSLSC's electricity consumption and associated utilities
- Scope 3: upstream and downstream emissions from supplier and customer activity related to NSSLSC—for example, emissions that went into producing goods purchased by NSSLSC.

MSSLSC's Scope 1 emissions are confined to goods produced for sale on its 880s, plus transport related to SLS events (e.g. carnivals).
